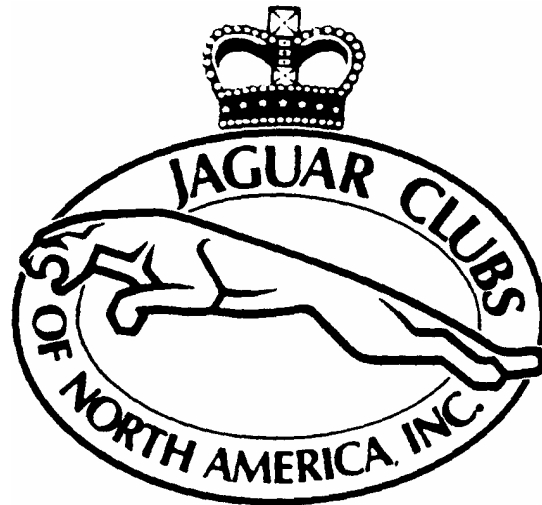

Chapter	Last Revised	Summary of Changes
1.	2008	Eliminated references to M1 and M1n classes. Widened allowable Monte Carlo maps, and various editorial corrections. Moved out several sections to TSD or Monte Carlo sections to put with remainder of program requirements.
2.	2008	Editorial changes to reduce redundancy and regroup some items. Reduce 8 week notice to 6 weeks.
3.	2008	Described open and passage checkpoints, clarified how to use ideal time, starting time, and car number to get your ideal chronological starting time.
4.	2008	Checkpoint procedures edited into this section from chapter 1.
5.	2008	Relocated TSD requirements from chapter 1. Entered limit of two route instruction per a single sign.

Chapter	Last Revised	Summary of Changes
6.	2008	Deleted reference to chapter 2, and opened options for Monte Carlo rally maps.
7.	2008	Clarified 5 driver, navigator, and car minimum limit from 5 cars. Addressed time allowances including for last car in event.
8.	2008	Novice program requirements added as to qualifications.
9.	2008	Revised to reduce classes, and make novice a single award for best finishes by a first year entrant.
