

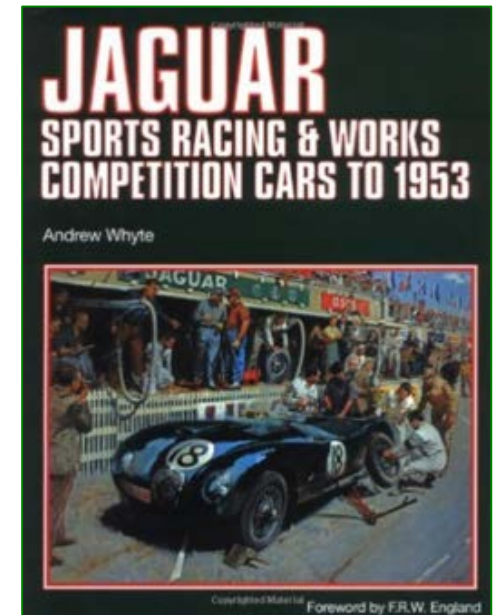
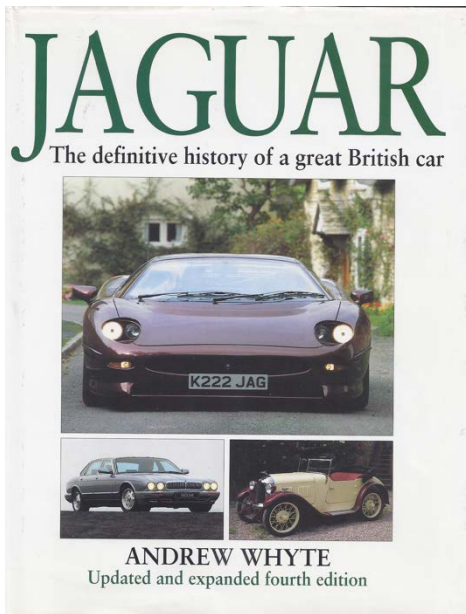

Andrew Whyte Award: Purpose

To recognize the the contributions of individuals who work for unity, cooperation and good relations within the JCNA network



Andrew Whyte Award: Criteria

Nominations for the Andrew Whyte Award are usually submitted by JCNA affiliate Clubs on behalf of members who volunteer their services well beyond the norm

1 – Recognized Service at the following levels:

- Local JCNA Club
- JCNA Region
- JCNA North America

2 – Eligibility

- Eligible: JCNA member in good standing
- Ineligible: Employees of Jaguar Land Rover.
Compensated work performed for JCNA or Clubs



Andrew Whyte Award: Criteria

3 - Presentation Intervals:

- The award will be presented at intervals of not less than 12 months. However, if the Special Awards Committee believes the criteria have not been met, it may not be presented in a given calendar year

4 – Services & Contributions: Efforts could have been performed at any time during the period of JCNA membership. There is no minimum qualifying period required

5 – Types of Service Qualifying a Nominee:

- Holding office(s)
- Working specific jobs at club events
- Regular attendance at club functions (i.e., general meetings, Board & planning meetings, events)
- Club Membership promotion/growth
- Working to improve communication with nearby clubs & JCNA
- Exhibiting leadership at local, regional and North American levels

Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award: Introduction

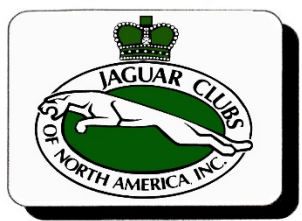
Frederic Horner served JCNA as Secretary from 1971 through 1991. For years, he handled club memberships and chaired the AGM. We remember him as a diplomat, mentor and friend who helped JCNA become a vital, active organization. He consistently labored to carry out the original mission of JCNA - *to provide a club that could bring Jaguar enthusiasts together in good fellowship and friendly competition*

He believed that *family enjoyment should be the goal of all JCNA events* and his concept of JCNA Championships was based on camaraderie and sportsmanship. The Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award honors Members who work and compete in JCNA following the ideals and precepts of Fred Horner



Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award: Purpose

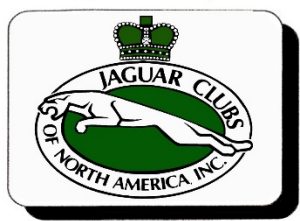
The Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award recognizes JCNA Members who are out and about with their Jaguars, sharing fellowship with other JCNA Members. It promotes more participation, expands local activities, gets more Jaguars out in front of the public and promotes additional membership



Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award: Past Criteria (prior to 2011)

Previous Qualifications:

- A Member cannot apply for, nor be nominated for this award. To qualify for the Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award, **Members must complete 3 separate Concours, 2 Rallies and 1 Slalom.** The competition year extends from January 1st through December 31st of any given year
- Very few JCNA Members had the ability to compete in these different events so very few were eligible



Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award: New Criteria (2012 onward)

Current Qualifications:

The new Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award is based upon participation in *sanctioned* JCNA vehicle events, regardless of how many of each event, the score obtained or the Jaguar entered

Credit is awarded as follows:

- Concours participation is one credit per Jaguar entered in Championship, Driven, Special and Display Classes, 2 cars per event maximum
- The Driver and Navigator in a Rally both receive one credit
- Slalom participation is one credit per Driver
- Class Z does not count for credit



Frederic Horner Sportsmanship Award: New Criteria (2012 onward)

Qualifications: *Continued*

- Since JCNA Memberships are Family Memberships, husband, wife and even Junior Members add to the family participation score
- Under the revised criteria, the award is now considered a lifetime award. This gives others a chance to earn the award
- With few Rally events available, we considered allowing Club-sanctioned Drives of more than 50 miles count as participation towards this award. We were not able to keep track of the Drives so this never developed. This is still being considered

- This Award was created to recognize and thank them for their efforts





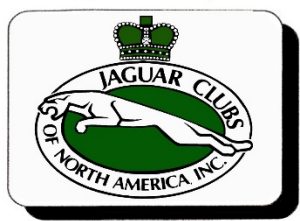
President's Award: Purpose

- The candidates must have exhibited outstanding performance for the benefit of JCNA



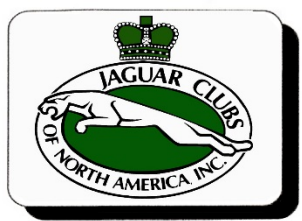

- The Jaguar Dealership of the Year Award was created to honor a special Jaguar Dealer and so it is not a competitive trophy and dealers should not expect to "win" this award

- The Dealer must be operating an authorized Jaguar Dealership
- Dealership time donated to local Club(s)
- Money or in-kind donations provided to local Club(s)
- Participation in local Club's meetings, Concours and other activities
- Assisting with Club membership promotion/growth

Karen Miller (1945 – 2003) was an active contributor to the growth of JCNA for more than 30 years. Her contributions included:

- Chaired the original Concours Committee, originated the AGM Technical Seminars & served as a JCNA Regional Director
- Maintained the JCNA Roster and co-wrote the 1st JCNA Rule Book
- Established the Andrew Whyte, Frederic Horner and Newsletter Awards
- Professionally, she was the *Jaguar Journal* Associate Editor from 1985 & the Jaguar Cars North America Archivist from 1990

This award is presented annually to the JCNA affiliate newsletter Editor who best represents Karen Miller's talents and ideals as a writer, editor, historian and ultimate Jaguar club volunteer



Karen Miller Award: Criteria

Why is this award important?

A good newsletter is the lifeline for every local JCNA Club. The Editor who puts out a timely, well-produced publication, packed with club information and news, is directly contributing to keeping the organization healthy and active

What must the award winner accomplish?

The recipient will qualify by producing at least three newsletters to the highest standards of editorial content and production within the consideration year



Karen Miller Award: Criteria

- Overall design (cover, layout, production values)
- Neatness (organized, variety not clutter, typo-free)
- Clear graphics (font, readability)
- Headlines (interest-catching, creative)
- Effective content (photos and text)
- Good quality writing (clear, creative, entertaining)
- Interesting perspectives (unexpected and unique)
- Length (number of pages)

- Contents listing
- Club contacts, membership information
- Messages from Editor, President, Club Officers
- Club calendar and details of future/past events
- JCNA (national and regional events)
- Notices/reports on other classic car events

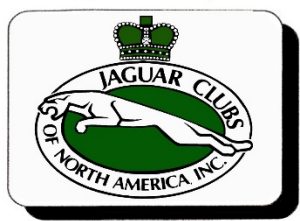

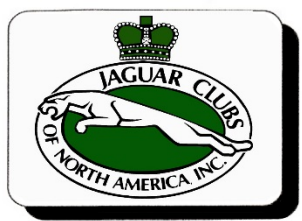

Newsletter Awards: Criteria

Criteria for Newsletter awards:

- Must have appeared in a JCNA Club Newsletter in the calendar year being judged
- Minimum of 250 words
- Interesting catchy title
- Well-written, clear presentation, attractive, easy to follow
- Grammatically correct (including sentence structure, punctuation), typo-free and in a consistent voice
- Written in an informative and entertaining fashion
- Does the article's appearance stimulate the reader's interest?
- When applicable and effective, **good clear photos** captioned to reference the story. [One good picture is worth a thousand words]



Newsletter Awards: Criteria

- One submission per award class will be accepted from each Club for each of the six Club Newsletter Award categories
- A Club and Author can compete for Newsletter Awards year-after-year
- In the case of articles, the Award category for judging should be named
- The JCNA Club, the publication date, the Author/Photographer and the page number of the issue where the article or photograph appeared should be listed
- Photo submissions will be reviewed as they were published in the Club Newsletter, in either full color or B & W. (The Award has no preference for either color or B & W)
- The Author/Photographer must be a Club Member

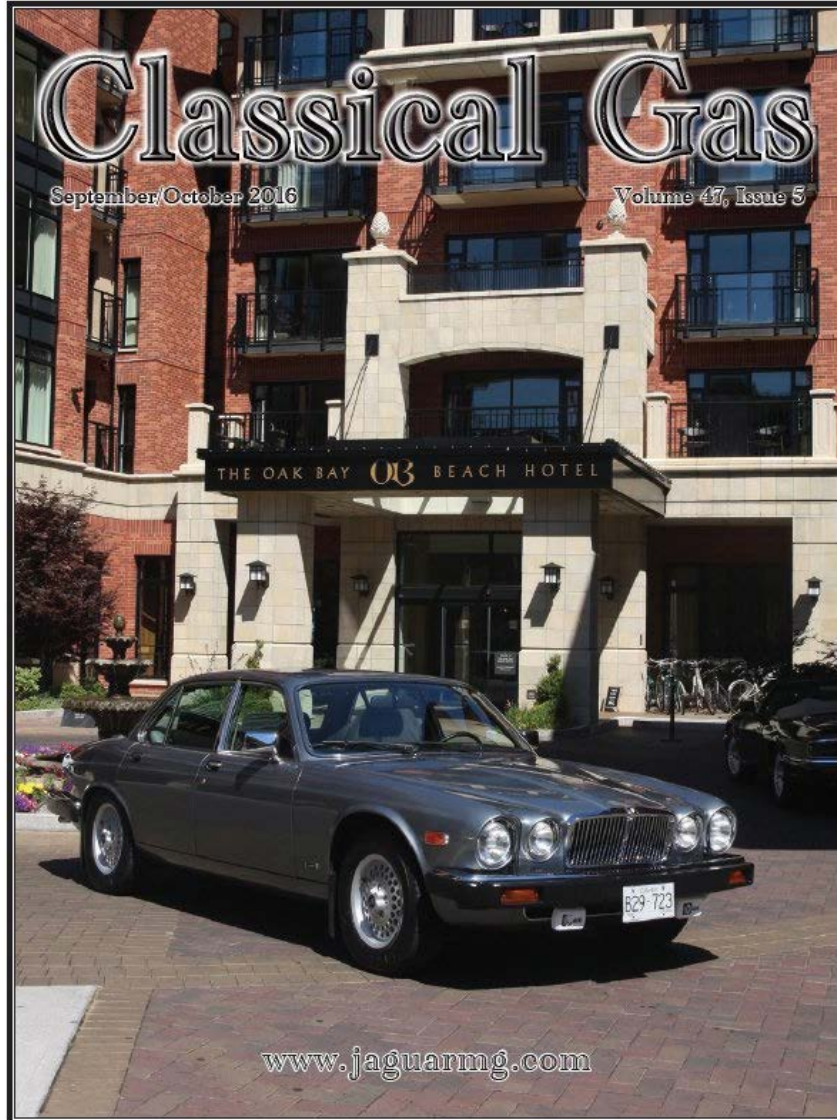


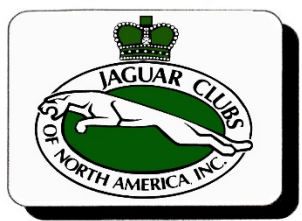

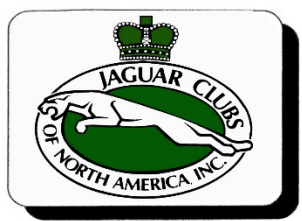
Why recognize Newsletter Photos?

- The old adage “A picture is worth a thousand words” is still true. Great photos add depth, color and character to Club Newsletter articles
- Great photos draw readers into an article and encourage reading of the article
- Creating great photos is more than simple chance and opportunity. The very best photos are composed and the result of thought and consideration



Photography Newsletter Award: Purpose

- To recognize excellence in photography in Club Newsletters
- To raise awareness of the importance of great photos in Club Newsletters



Photography Newsletter Award: Criteria

- Photos can be color or black and white
- The nominated Photo should be entered exactly as it was presented in the Club newsletter. If it was presented as a ¼ page, submit as such
- The Photo must be taken by a Club Member
- Newsletter/magazine issue and page number where the Photo appeared must be listed
- Photographer must be listed
- The location, date, content and names of any people in the Photo should be included if possible



Photography Newsletter Award: Criteria

Photos are judged on:

- Relevance to Jaguar Club life
- Subject interest
- Composition
- Color and contrast
- Capturing a creative activity
- Primary subject is well-focused
- Support of the article's subject if the Photo is part of an article

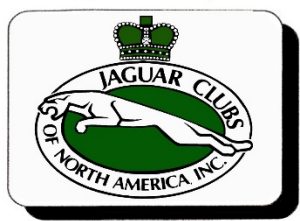


Man pushes broken down Jaguar XK-120 during the Havana-Guinea-Cienfuegos race in 1955.



Technical Newsletter Award: Purpose

To recognize and encourage informative articles on the care, maintenance, repair and restoration of Jaguars



Technical Newsletter Award: Criteria

- Applicability to the greatest number of Members. How does the Article fit the profile of Jaguar Members?
- Accuracy of information. To the best of my knowledge or the knowledge of people I can ask, is it accurate?
- Does the Article clearly state the problem being solved?
- Documentation of sources of information referenced in the Article. Did the Article give traceable reference information about what they did?
- Style and format of the Article. Was the Article written in a logical order or did it skip around or leave the reader thinking "What happened here?"
- Does the Article list the estimated time and skill level for the technical task(s)?
- Does the Article list tools and any equipment needed for the task?
- Does the Article list any spare parts or materials needed for the task and sources for these?

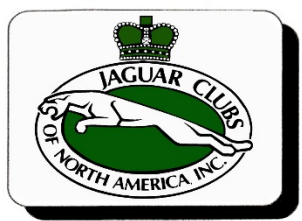

Jaguars on the Screen

PART 1: MOTION PICTURES

The two Jaguar XKE cars featured in the film were a black fixed head coupe 619 DXX and a 1961 red roadster 848 CRY. Both were several years old by this time and were sourced by the producers for £900 each. Little is known of the black coupe other than it is believed to have been restored, but the red roadster has an interesting history. It was the 12th E-Type to be built and served initially as a demonstrator for a dealer in Leicester. It was also the very first E-Type to be used in motorsport, raced by Robin Sturgess in 1961. This car survived the film and was completely restored during the 1990s. Today it is owned by renowned author and historian Philip Porter and has appeared in several magazine articles as well as BBC's Top Gear program.

is seen driving a black 1957 Jaguar XK150 drop head coupe in various scenes along the California coast including the famous bridges on Highway 1.

Clint Eastwood was one of numerous Hollywood movie stars to own one of the Jaguar XKs. Other notable XK owners among the Hollywood stars included Gary Cooper, Clark Gable and Harrison Ford.

1971 – PLAY MISTY FOR ME

This American psychological thriller was the first film to be directed by Clint Eastwood, in which he also starred as a disc jockey stalked by an obsessive woman. Much of the film was set in and shot around the area of Carmel-by-the-Sea, California, where the director lived for many years and was elected mayor in 1996. Clint Eastwood

2002 – DIE ANOTHER DAY

This was the 20th film in the James Bond series and the last to star Pierce Brosnan as 007. During the film, Bond arrives in Iceland driving a specially equipped and armed Aston Martin Vanquish. The sequence in Iceland

Last month's release of the 24th James Bond film Spectre brings with it another exciting car chase, and yet another chase sequence featuring a Jaguar. While the Aston Martin brand is more typically associated with the Bond films, the Jaguar Land Rover marque has also enjoyed a long association with the films. In fact, Jaguar cars have enjoyed a lengthy resume on film and in television, and it is worth looking back at some of their more notable appearances on screen. Here are five such examples:

1958 - VERTIGO

Alfred Hitchcock's thriller Vertigo was shot in San Francisco during 1957 and featured a green Jaguar Mark VIII sedan from that year. Jaguar cars were an elegant and exotic alternative in the American car market at the time, and in this film, the female character's Jaguar contrasts with the 1956 DeSoto driven by actor James Stewart. This was intentional on the part of the director so the characters could be distinguished easily from each other while driving. Hitchcock was known for utilizing automobiles to establish a scene and to transport the story, and the Jaguar Mark VIII and DeSoto were used prominently throughout the film in this way.

It is interesting to note that the colour green was not an

option for the Jaguar Mark VIII in 1957. Hitchcock used different shades of green in his portrayal of the character Madeleine (played by actress Kim Novak) who drives the car in the film. For this reason it is likely that the director had the car re-sprayed for the film. Madeleine's Jaguar survives to this day and resides in a private collection in California.

1969 – THE ITALIAN JOB

This British caper film featured a number of cars which now enjoy strong collector status, including the Lamborghini Miura, the Aston Martin DB4, the Jaguar XKE Coupe and Roadster, and even the trio of Austin Mini Coopers. Unfortunately, most of these cars meet an unfortunate and violent demise early in the film, courtesy of the Mafia's front end loaders. The Aston Martin and the two Jaguars were intended to serve as fast getaway cars, but whilst en route to the scene of the crime in Turin, Italy, they are pushed off a cliff and they plunge to their cinematic demise. A Daimler Majestic also appears briefly in the film.

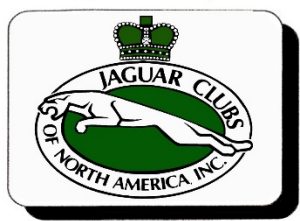


The green 1957 Jaguar Mark VIII sedan driven by Kim Novak in the Alfred Hitchcock thriller Vertigo.

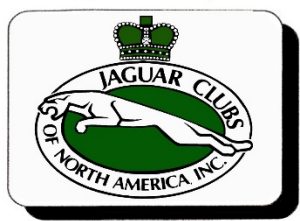
Jaguar Journal Newsletter Award: Criteria

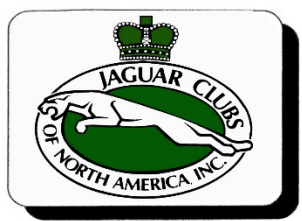
