

Museum Displays:

As part of the celebrations for the **60th anniversary of the Jaguar D-type**, a special commemorative display has recently been installed in the Jaguar Heritage gallery at the Heritage Motor Centre museum at Gaydon.

Centrepiece of the display is, of course, a Jaguar D-type! The car on show is a very unique example being the first prototype that was built in early 1954. This prototype, with chassis number XKC 401 (as it was a development from the C-type model), was taken straight to Le Mans for testing in May 1954, where Jaguar's principal test engineer, Norman Dewis, immediately broke the previous lap record by a clear 5 seconds! This was the start of the D-type's illustrious race history which saw many victories over the following six years in UK, Europe and USA, including three in the Le Mans 24 hour race itself.

The D-type is flanked by two other very famous cars from the Jaguar Heritage collection:

 The 1950 XK120, registration NUB 120, that was driven by lan Appleyard with his wife Patricia (daughter of Jaguar founder William Lyons) acting as navigator in several races and rallies. Ian won the Alpine Rally twice, the RAC Rally and the Tulip rally as well as being the first winner of the Alpine Gold Cup for three consecutive runs without incurring a penalty point!




The one and only XJ13 from 1966. Designed to be a Le Mans competitor to succeed the D-type, the XJ13 was fitted with a quad cam 5.0 litre V12 engine to give it a top speed approaching 200mph. Sadly the rules were changed before it was completed, limiting Le Mans cars to engine capacities not exceeding 3.0 litres. This left the XJ13 sidelined and this is the only complete surviving example.

Behind these cars are a number of display panels which provide a brief history of the D-type and also list 60 interesting facts about the car - some well-known and some more obscure!

To complement the vehicles, the Jaguar Heritage Archive team has also assembled a fascinating collection of D-type related artefacts which have been put on display in two cabinets. These include a number of items kindly loaned by the family of Malcolm Sayer, who is credited with the design of some of the most iconic Jaguars from the 1950s and 60s including the D-type, E-type and the XJ13. Amongst these artefacts are several scale models of potential designs, one of Malcolm's original note books and an example of his painting skills!

The special display will run throughout the summer season so make sure you plan a visit sometime between May and August. ◆

5 April, 2014 - The 31st annual All British Car Show was held in truly gorgeous weather at Mead Garden in Winter Park. The location is ideal for the show with shade trees, good driving lanes and parking areas, a pavilion for lunch, door prizes, and silent auction items display area.

The show organizers gratefully acknowledge the generous contributions of our sponsors to the success of the show. Particularly our Platinum sponsors, the Fields Motor Group who have supported us for many years and the Best of Show sponsor Fiddlers Green Irish pub. Fields bought several Minis and Land Rovers for display--hope they sold one so they will come back next year.

Attendance at the show was great, we had over 170 cars, slightly down from the 180 of 2013 but with a diversity of entrants that covered all of the British Marques. An early 1930's Austin 7 superbly restored, was the oldest car together with another Austin7. The representation of the MG, Triumph, Morgan, Austin Healey and our own Jaguars cars covered the full range, joined by Aston Martins, Sunbeam Tigers and race cars for sale by Wire Wheels. A great turnout.

Judging for the show is a people's choice format, resulting in a Best of Show win for a well-restored early Jaguar XK 120 coupe in dark green. We had not seen this car before so perhaps here is an opportunity for a new member.

As part of the show, the Valve Cover racing, managed by our own Tom Curren (thanks Tom), was won by a simulated Spitfire (the aircraft, not the car). If you have not tried this get ready for next year by putting wheels on a valve cover for racing down a ramp.

Our thanks to those who contributed to the success of the show, 4Rivers catering for lunch, contributors of silent auction items, our vendors, Friends of Mead Garden, and the many volunteers.

Financially, the success of the show allowed us to donate \$400 to each of the five organizing clubs and \$200 to the Garden

We have booked Mead Garden for the 2015 show, so mark your calendars for 11 April. A Kokopelli with a Tryst of Orange

CENTRAL FL - On Saturday, April 19, 2014, nine JCOF vehicles (eight Cats and a Rover) assembled at TOOJAY's in Dr. Phillips for a morning run through the west central Florida countryside. With the skies threatening rain, only Paul Harder in his XK120 had the top down.

For the most part Mother Nature cooperated – only one very brief and very light shower. The secret to staying dry is simply to drive fast enough. The three XK8s left the tops up. One had driven through heavy rain from Ocala to the northern Orlando limits to get to the starting point.

Participants in the delightful romp led by Jazy and Karen Hixson in their XK8 were Bill and Carol Robertson Tom and Mari Kellman also in XK8's, Larry and Helen Heil and Robert and Judy Delmar in XK coupes, Mac Ballard in his XJ sedan, Danny

and Dianna Bogdany in their XKE 2+2 and Tom and Liza Wright in their Rover.

After a run through Dr. Phillips and Windermere, the first stop was the Farmer's Market in historic Winter Garden. This marzzzzket is one of the most popular in central Florida and was well attended. Several of our members took advantage of the vender's wares.

From Winter Park, we proceeded west on FL-50 to Clermont and the Citrus Tower.





The Tower was built in 1956 on one of the highest hills in central Florida to showcase the Citrus industry. At that time (before the devastating freezes of the 1980's), all one could see in any direction was citrus groves and lakes. Florida still produces 80% of this country's citrus.

From the Citrus Tower, we continued west on FL-50 through Groveland, Mabel, and Linden to the rest stop at the Sunoco Station in Terrytown. This stop although brief was a welcome chance to stretch the "human" legs.

From the Sunoco station rest stop we proceeded south on SR-471 – 21.2 miles of absolutely straight country road before turning onto US-98 and continuing on to the lunch stop in Dade City. Several of our cats took advantage of the conditions to stretch their "Jaguar" legs.





The lunch stop in Dade City was a "Mexican" restaurant named *Kafé Kokopelli*. The building housing the restaurant was built in 1913 by Ford Motor Company as a sales and service center for their Model T's. When the facility was restored and converted, the original belt driven machine shop equipment was discovered. Allegedly, it was one of the last belt driven systems known to exist. It was removed and is now on display in the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, DC. For those considering paying a visit, I strongly recommend it. The Prime Rib dip and the Ruben sandwiches were exceptional. •

Since its beginning, Jaguar Cars has been producing some of the most sought after and beautiful cars of any automobile manufacturer. Our Concours delivered a prime example of that as the field spanned eight decades ranging from Ginger Corda's 1935 SSII Tourer "Grace" to a 2014 F-type convertible. The fastest on the street? Rocky Grady's 1958 Tojiero Jaguar (one of only four in existence and the only one in the United States), and Ian Crawford's beautiful XJ 220. The pride of Jaguar on display included gorgeous XK 120s, XK 150s, E-Types, XJs , as well as Jaguar Saloons--the earliest being a 1949 Preservation Class Mark IV owned by Penny Petty. The lineup was completed by freshly polished XK8s, XKRs, an S-Type, and an X-Type Sportbrake. The Jaguars glistened in the beautiful Florida Sunshine as every vehicle was showroom-ready.

Celebration Town Center became a pedestrian mall with the cars being the center of attention. They attracted every generation; Joseph Tarnowski overheard a grandfather talking to his grandson about owning a Jaguar XJ6 saloon back in the 70s describing the pure enjoyment of just driving it.

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
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
