Item 1a) Jaguar Cars Update

Greg Sanguinetti, Jaguar Designated Director gave his report:

Greg gave a comprehensive report on the administrative changes at Jaguar North America, production facilities modifications and closures, model changes and specific marketing niches. Greg articulated production figures, interior offerings, and the new direction for Jaguar marketing as a brand.

Item 2b) 'Corporate Identity' Presentation: *Connie Cunningham* gave an extremely detailed presentation related to Jaguar's focus on Corporate identity, defining the Marque (in advertisements) as an 'upscale brand' and marketing to 'a lifestyle', the foundation of the 'Gorgeous Campaign'.. A comprehensive handout related to the legalities and reproduction of the Jaguar logo was also explained.

In summary, Connie reinforced that Jaguar wants to partner with JCNA WANTS TO PARTNER WITH JCNA -redeliver JAGUAR in the marketplace, as we are Jaguar's greatest advocates.

What we are doing with the brand- is esthetic & creative brand refreshing- ing & repositioning!

Wants us to have information to bring people to the Jaguar family. We have a small but great story to tell, & it is acknowledged in the market place. Connie offered herself as a resource.

Rallye Committee Pioposals Passed:

8. The proposed rule changes enacted at this AGM were:

- 8.1. Refined the definition of the word 'Novice' in the Glossary
 - 8.2. Clarification of the Glossary definition of the word 'straight' (D. Meck request, I believe)
- 8.3. An editorial relocation of the optional features clause in the Rules
- 8.4. Allowing rallymasters to put as much ideal time info as they want in the route instructions (removing stage end time 'secrecy' clause, amended to be for novices only)
- 8.5. Clarification of how and when to determine who is a 'Novice'
- 8.6. Changing maximum allowable of 4 hours to maximum recommended length
- 8.7. Adding that only paid members on the JCNA roster are eligible for points
- 8.8. Clarify how Rally Committee addresses protests
- 8.9. Prohibit class changes after the event has started.
- 8.10.Changing to highest three scores rather than total number of points (tie break schemes that Dave and Brian drafted were amended out during the vote) Note: we will have a tie every year now.
- 8.11. Addition of hidden checkpoints within a stage (sometimes called open controls). Addition of stand-offs at the ends of stages was amended out of the above proposal.
