
#### **Officers of JCSNE** — Club Secretaries through the Years

# **Concours Observations and Potential Rule Changes** by Robert Silvestri, Jaguar Club of Southern New England

Numerous articles have been written concerning how to prepare your Jaguar for Concours competitions, from cleaning to waxing to fine detailing and more. However, very few, if any, of the articles delve into the nuances of the JCNA Concours rules. I had the opportunity and the pleasure to judge several JCNA Concours this past year and will present a few of the problem areas that I observed, along with some expected changes to the rules that should be approved at the 2020 JCNA Annual General Meeting (AGM).

<u>Windshield Stickers</u> This issue arose at one of the Concours at which a well-meaning individual had and distributed a number of non-Jaguar windshield stickers to various participants. Some participants applied the stickers to their windshields and that's where the problems began.

The 2019 JCNA Concours Rule Book (Chapter V) specifies the following:

- "Decals, labels, or permits required or legal operation, access, or like purposes, may be neatly affixed to the vehicle's glass or bumpers without deduction." This could include state inspection stickers, vehicle registration stickers and the like. However, stickers such as "Look But Don't Touch" are not allowed and their presence will result in point deductions.
- "An Entrant may also display a maximum of two window or bumper stickers or decals issued by JCNA or its affiliates or by organizations which promote automobile preservation, exhibition, or restoration."
- "Dash plaques commemorating JCNA concours or similar events, are allowed in Driven and Special Divisions only. Plaques should be neatly affixed to the dash or console." These plaques are <u>not</u> allowed in Champion Division.

<u>**Tire Valve Stem Caps</u>** This issue came into the spotlight more this past year due to rule updates. There was confusion, and the issue of tire valve stem caps will again be a focus this year due to the expected clarifications in the Concours rules. Let's first revisit 2019.</u>

The 2019 Rule Book Updates included tire valve stem caps with the following provisions:

- "Tire valve stems should have valve stem caps appropriate to the vintage."
- "Pre-1955 Jaguar tire valve stems should have cadmium-plated, dome-type metal valve stem caps."
- The years 1955 to 1962 will be treated as a transitional period for Jaguars. Until proven otherwise or by newly discovered evidence, either domed metal or domed black plastic valve stem caps will be treated as authentic.
- All four valve stem caps on the road wheels plus the valve stem cap on the spare tire must match. Slotted metal valve stem caps, with the core removal extension, are non-authentic. (A separate core removal tool is included in the factory tool kit.) 1963 and onward models should have dome-type black plastic valve stem caps. Logo valve stem caps must be shown to have been an authentic Jaguar Cars accessory for the specific year and model they are presented on. Green-colored valve stem caps, indicating the use of nitrogen gas, are not an authorized Jaguar accessory and, therefore, are nonauthentic. The type of gas in the tire is not a judging issue."

Now, fast-forward to the expected changes for **2020** and some major clarifications by comparing the following to the bulleted list above:

- Champion Division tire valve stems should have valve stem caps appropriate to the vintage.
- Swallow and SS-bodied cars as well as pre-1955 Jaguar tire valve stems should have cadmium-plated, dome-type metal valve stem caps.

- The years 1955 to 1978 will be treated as a transitional period for Jaguars. Until proven otherwise or by newly discovered evidence, either domed metal or domed black plastic valve stem caps will be treated as authentic.
- From 1978 onward, valve stem caps may either be the plastic or metal dome-type.
- All four valve stem caps on the road wheels plus the valve stem cap on the spare tire must match. Slotted metal valve stem caps, with the core removal extension, will be treated as missing and given a non-authentic deduction. (A separate core removal tool was included in the factory tool kit for the US market up until 1968.)
- Valve stem caps with Jaguar related logos on them must be appropriate for the vintage and will be scored as non-authentic unless the entrant can prove that Jaguar Cars Inc., Jaguar Canada Inc., or Jaguar Cars Ltd offered them for that specific model and year. For Champion Division, green-colored valve stem caps indicating the use of nitrogen gas, not originally factory supplied, will be given a non-authentic deduction.
- Driven Division valve stem caps are only judged for their presence, condition and cleanliness, although the caps still need to be in good taste and not display novelty themes. Green-colored valve stem caps, are acceptable in Driven Division. Again, the type of gas in the tire is not a judging issue.
- Missing valve stem caps must be given a non-authentic deduction.
- And while it should go without saying, valve stem caps with non-Jaguar related insignias such as happy faces, dice, etc., will be treated as missing and given a non-authentic deduction.

Should vehicles have tire valve stems and valve stem caps that don't adhere to the above, it is imperative that documentation be available to verify that those items are indeed proper for the year and model of the vehicle. Check the JCNA Rule Book in Chapter VI for "Authenticity Documentation," a portion of which is reproduced below:

"Authentic parts, options, and configurations are only those listed and/or illustrated in:

- a. Official Jaguar Cars Ltd. Parts Books, Service Manuals and Owner's Manuals;
- b. Jaguar Cars Inc. and Jaguar Canada Inc. Sales Literature and Accessory Brochures;
- c. Official JCNA model-specific Judging Guides.

d. JCNA Seminar Technical Bulletins\*, where the content quotes or copies Jaguar Cars or certain JCNA publications."

To re-emphasize, the proposed 2020 changes to the Tire Valve Stem Caps sections of the rules have not been finalized as of this writing. It is important to check the updates to the 2020 Concours rules when published, and then check your valves stem caps to ensure compliance for Concours entries.

<u>**Transponders for Highway Toll Gantries</u>** Attendees to Concours events do travel to get to the show field. Some of their vehicles may have toll transponders that are affixed to the windshields. The JCNA Rule Book is silent when it comes to toll transponders. Chapter VI of the Rule Book discusses various accessories such as the following:</u>

"Electronic Telephones, Alarm Systems and Radar Detectors: No deduction for neatly installed telephones, alarm systems or their accessories authorized by the factory, Jaguar Cars Inc. or Jaguar Canada Inc. Radar detectors were offered by all dealers on XJS for a period and were also installed by Jaguar Cars Ltd.; they were contained in a special case and stowed in the void above the steering column nacelle. All other radar detectors, NOT provided by either Jaguar Cars Ltd. or Jaguar Cars Inc., will be considered non-authentic."

# **Do You Know What Model This Is?** by Bob Brown

What kind of model Jaguar is this, you might ask? Considering that this is Alta's March— April issue of the club's newsletter, the answer, in part is **April Fool!** Yes, it is no Jaguar at all. The vehicle shown below is really a toy, although it's not bad as a scale model. It's a late-1980s/early 1990s Porsche 911 Cabriolet, Mattel issued it in the early 1990s as a vehicle for the ever-popular, best-selling *Barbie*. Accordingly, it is guite large at 21" long.

Regarding prices, I have seen Barbie Porsches listed on eBay from about \$50, incomplete examples, to more than \$200 for new, unassembled toys in their original boxes. My Barbie Porsche is missing a few items, including the seat belts, the car phone and the box; however, I paid about \$10 at a car show flea market and don't mind the lost pieces. rSome can argue that they are a necessity. While this may be true, would transponders be considered a state-required device (similar to window registration stickers)? The answer is "no." Would transponders be considered "government issued?" Again, the answer is "no." While transponders may be issued by a motor vehicle department or contractor, they are not a government-required device and are issued for the convenience of the traveler.

Overall, in keeping with the intent of this chapter, it appears that toll transponders affixed to windshields would be considered "non-authentic."

However, there is a means to have a toll transponder and not have it permanently affixed to the windshield to avoid getting into the gray areas of judging. Various vendors, particularly on the internet, offer mesh bags. These bags hold the transponder and are equipped with a drawstring. The transponder fits in the bag and the drawstring attaches to the back of the rearview mirror. The transponder will still function as if it were attached to the windshield but the mesh bag and transponder can be easily removed for Concours and replaced afterwords. Consider the mesh bag device as a stop-gap until JCNA formally addresses toll transponders and their placement on windshields.

<u>**Cleanliness</u>** This item should stand without further comment, but I have observed a number of vehicles whose interiors should have been better. For example, a number of later-model Jaguars have pockets in the doors. However, these pockets need to be devoid of trash, keys, maps, etc. before the vehicle is presented for judging. Similarly, anything else that doesn't belong in a vehicle that will be judged needs to be removed. Umbrellas, hats, blankets, stuffed animals, etc. all fall into this category.</u>

**Operation Verification** The last item to be reviewed is Operation Verification, or "OV" that deals with the functionality of various systems. The systems judged for functionality include the following:

- · Horns
- · Headlights High and Low Beams
- · Driving Lights
- · Fog Lights Front and Rear
- · Parking, Tail, Side, License Plate and LED Daytime Running Lights
- · Brake Lights
- · Backup (Reverse) Lights
- Turn Signals.

Chapter V of the JCNA Rule Book provides detail in the expected functionality of each system and, of course, not all makes and models may be equipped with all of the systems (e.g., LED Running Lights, Fog Lights). However, participants should become familiar with the location of the switches for those systems that need to be "turned on," especially how the fog lights are operated.

Notably absent from the above list is the operation of a four-way flasher system, typically referred to as hazard lights or emergency flashers. It is anticipated that the 2020 AGM will approve the inclusion of testing the functionality of a four-way flasher system for November 1965-on model cars.

Along with the functionality test, the interior will also be judged for missing or for a non-authentic method of creating a four-way flasher system for November 1965-on up to, but not including, XJ and Series 2 E-Type US model cars.

Like the proposed changes to the tire valve stem caps, check the updates to the 2020 Concours rules when published and keep your systems ready to function.
