

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



Frazier Lake Airfield Trip

2020 BFC TOUR to FRAZIER LAKE Airfield

So, What's a BFC tour and why? BFC stands for British Fall Classic and it was run by Bill Hiland's "On the Road Again Classics" personnel Cecile Chronister and his business partner Rachel. This tour is by invitation and anyone who has attended the Morgan Hill British car show in the past was sent an invite. We started out at 8:30 at Bill's shop in Morgan Hill.

I think there were 54 cars attending including 16 MG's from to TD's up thru MGA, MGB and and MG v8? There were 9 Triumphs up thru a TR6 and 2 Sunbeam Tigers and 6 Austin Healey's from a Sprite up thru 100's and some 3000's. There were also 10 lovely Jaguars from Ron Laurie's lovely 1939 SS1 DHC thru XK 120s, an XJS, some E-TYPES and a more modern one. Also present were an Allard J2X, an Aston Martin DB7, a Lotus Elise and even a Land Rover Military Lightweight and a lovely 1985 black Silver Spur II.

After gazing at the eye candy while eating a provided breakfast, we had a driver's meeting and they handed out the map and directions to take us on a very woodsy almost 2 hour winding trip out of Morgan Hill, down past San Juan Batista and to the destination, the FRAZIER LAKE airfield near Hollister, California (east of Gilroy towards Pacheco pass). We drove our 72 Jaguar E-TYPE Series III V12 Coupe. Note: For those of you who have been in the RROC for many decades, this car belonged to Sam Girdler of Oroville from new! Each car was given two 12" commemorative Roundel's to be placed on the front doors of each car participating. You will see them on the cars in the pictures following, mostly taken by Eric Lane who drove his 2007 Jaguar. He kindly allowed me to download these pictures after explaining to me how to do it. Fortunately for us, Steve Pedone (who is a Car Guy of Los Gatos member) kindly applied the stickers on our doors and those who did not follow the directions lost theirs on the drive, some even before getting out of Morgan Hill! Ours lasted the whole day and even on the trip home on the freeway.

The almost two hour trip thru Morgan Hill, then to Gilroy, past Mt. Madonna County Park, then Hecker Pass Highway, past Aromas and thru San Juan Batista past their mission, then Pacheco Pass Highway and eventually to a small road which took us to the entrance to the Frazier Lake airfield where we were met by a member of their crew and given the instructions about watching for airplanes, people, bicycles and dogs and being watchful. We were then parked next to the buildings that hide the lovely historical aircraft. The cost for this tour included the roundels, a nice breakfast (at On The Road Again Classics) and a lunch which was given to us at the airfield. We were allowed to sit in the shade under the wings of numerous antique aircraft that were out on the lawn. While we were having lunch, several aircraft took off on their 2500 x 100 foot turf runway. I tried to get a radial engine biplane taking off but did not do it well, even using ZOOM as it was quite far back from where we were sitting. The first Saturday of the month the airfield has a public display day and many aircraft are displayed. We sat under a 1946 Stinson Voyager (yellow) that was fully restored and chatted with a Northern Cal RROC member about his Spur and the trials of having some of his woodwork destroyed when it was shipped to the UK for restoration and was returned... All broken. Ouch!.

The drive down was fun for us as we followed (until the rest stop for people to catch up) a Sunbeam Tiger or two and an MG V8. The Tiger has a 260 cubic inch Ford engine and the MG V8 was a Rover derived Buick 215 V8 Both drivers were very happy to use their throttles and the sounds were great fun! Thanks to Eric Lane for the pictures that he showed me how to download. To see them all you can put in





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Why We Drive Jaguars

This is Why We Drive Jaguars A New Rule for Cars: Don't Look So Standard!

Fuel and safety mandates have made them all look the same. Expect California to step in again.

First, California banned the sale of gas-powered cars after the year 2035. Then it got car companies to sign on to its own tough emission standards. It's obvious what's next, isn't it? California will become the first state to mandate that by 2035, cars must cease to be visually interchangeable.

"You've got the Accord that looks like the Camry that looks like the Sonata, and this just has to stop," says a high-ranking state official. "It's incredibly boring to get on the 101 and drive from Los Angeles to San Francisco and maybe see three cars that don't look like every other car. And it makes it harder to catch speeders, because all the cars look the same."

"It's really bad with vans," adds a second, more medium-ranking official. "Car companies developed a couple of basic designs in the 1990s, and they've stuck with them. A van that rolled off the assembly line in 2004 doesn't look much different than one you bought yesterday. I know. I bought one in 2004."

Car companies agree that their products suffer from a pitiful uniformity. They nod remorsefully that it would be nicer for everyone if cars were not so bland, generic, sleep-inducing. Then they point out, with some pique, that aerodynamic and structural innovations intended to make cars more fuel-efficient and safer are largely to blame.

Privately, many in the auto industry concede that if five contemporary sedans got put into a police lineup, all five would go free.

"Look, you're basically dealing with a rectangular-shaped box," says one Motor City CEO. "Short of adding Nifty Fifties fins or running boards or some kind of weird sunroof or turret, there's just no way to make one car look different from every other car."

"You could start making cars in the shape of a rhombus or a parallelogram," says a veteran Japanese car industry executive. "You could add garish hood ornaments shaped like flying squid or Medusa. But how long would it be before the fickle public started complaining about that?"

Other states are furious at California's high-handed attitude. This is largely because people in other parts of the country have some different ideas about aesthetics.

"We don't care that every pickup truck looks like every other pickup truck," fumes one official from the Montana DMV. "Half the year they're covered in ice, and half the year



they're covered in mud. What difference would it make if they had a more opulent design?"

"First it's draconian emission standards, then it's unrealistic fuel mileage, and now it's government-mandated visually compelling design," adds an Alabama congresswoman who still tools around in a 1996 Saturn station wagon. "What gives Californians the right to lord it over the rest of us? A lot of us like uninteresting cars. It makes car thieves less likely to steal them."

Privately, many in the auto industry concede that if five contemporary sedans got put into a police lineup, all five would go free. They admit that if your fob goes on the fritz outside the Rose Bowl you'll never find your Honda Civic. But they object to California mandating an unrealistic time frame to fill the roads with more exciting vehicles.

"It took years to design the original Mustang, the 1966 Pontiac Bonneville," says one engineer. "It'd be nice to just flip a switch and presto—boring sedans would be replaced by sleek, sexy sports cars. But Rome wasn't built in a day and neither was the Corvette Stingray."

Libertarians are particularly incensed. "You let nerdy bureaucrats up in Sacramento start deciding what looks good and what doesn't look good and you'll end up with a country flooded with dinky little cars like the Volkswagen Beetle," says a spokesperson for the obscure Catullus Institute. "Remember when everyone thought those cars shaped like bread trucks were the wave of the future? How did that work out?"

Adds an award-winning designer: "For anyone who thinks it's a good idea to ask car makers to give us brilliant new looks, I've got two words: PT Cruiser."
