

### Letters to the Editor

Editor's note: Peter Irwin, of the Jaguar Enthusiasts Club of Great Britain, sent this. He used Sandy Duffy's article from the Sept. 2020 Indicator in their newsletter, and included us on the mail list for this letter/ article; we hope you'll enjoy his prose as we did!

Hello and hope you are all well. I thought I would give you a bit of an overview of the local area in which Billy Lyons grew up in. However I must clarify a slight point, if I have given you an impression of being related to the founders of Jaguar then I am definitely



out of order. There is connection but only through happenchance and the commercial vagaries from within the town itself, eg Billy still owes money to my grandfather (traded as a tailor) who made a suite for him, the cost was 15 guineas, a substantial amount in those days. To give you an example, a Deep Sea trawler skipper sailing from Fleetwood, some 7 miles north of The Tower, would only earned 5.00 quid a week, plus catch percentage of the landed stonage.

William Lyons was born in Blackpool. His father, an Irish musician, had visited Blackpool and met and married a Local girl (Slack Alice), the result of their

union was Billy. At the age of 20 Billy met a William Walmsley a fellow local chap, both of whom had more than a mutual interest in motorcycles, their combined enthusiasm lead to the forming Swallow Sidecars (SS). The workshops had a number of locations in the town, in fact one of shops remained manufacturing



sidecars up and until the early 60's but under new ownership and named Busmar.

The facility was located in Field Street between the Grounds of Blackpool Football Club and Central Station locomotive (steam) maintenance sheds. The side cars made by this company were generally based on a wood frame but some sporty sides were of aluminium/sheet metal construction and all were mounted on appropriate metal running gear in accordance with style chosen.

I actually worked at this company during the school summer break of '57, and in my own mind I saw myself as the corner stone and foundation of this enterprise, my job was trainee dogs body come gofer. The key duty I was responsible for was taking the MD secretary's pet poodle (Satan) for its daily ambulation. Walkies included the mandatory ceremonial duty of self administering marking of what it thought was its territorial domain; and at this point I must emphasise I'm talking about Satan's doing the marking, not me! There were quite a few lamp posts around, and amazingly, given the small size of Satan, "it" always and admirably so, fulfilled this particular duty.

Billy had left the area around 1928 and located to Folsehill, Coventry. Then around '51 onto Browns Lane primarily for the purposes of industrial production of the XK 120's and the Grace and Space Saloons; the rest you know about.

In the UK most meetings involving group gatherings have been cancelled, and along with the cancellations the face to face natter channels have lacked nourishment and dried up. However there are many tales of the past that are now popping up. One particular avenue has emerged and it is one of past tales, events

> and encounters with period celebrities. I have focused on the racing of Grace and Space Saloons, and I can assure there are characters galore. Have a butchers in YouTube "Unreal overtaking in a Jaguar Mk1 at Goodwood" and "Jack sears Memorial Trophy Highlights Goodwood Revival 2018", you will giggle until your ears

fall off. In the "Overtaking" video focus on the MK VII number 7; the character driving it is quite interesting, have you ever heard of: Black Adder, Mr Bean, Johnny English?

Current people I'm chatting to: Richard Waugh, Auckland New Zealand, Chris Louge, Melbourne Australia, Dan Mooney, Austin, Texas, Graham Love, Alton, Hampshire, England, Dave Tucker Toronto, Ontario.

If you want to drool, have a look at Dan Mooney site: Team CJ. Dan represents the high end of quality restoration. Over the last 20 years he created a leading business and his reputation is solid. Jay Leno is one of his clients and if my memory is correct Dan now takes care of Steve McQueen's SS 100 and Jay is the current custodian of it, but I will stand corrected, visit and trawl his site, it is very informative. Dan is English, from Durham, ex Scotland Yard detective, and that is something interesting too!

Matt Nold, 1958-2021

On December 8, 2020 JAGM lost long-time member Matt Nold. He was born in Fort Wayne, IN on February 28, 1958 to Curtis and the late Mary (Dilgard) Nold. Matt graduated from Southside High School in Fort Wayne and ITT Technical Institute with a major in robotics. This led to working in the automo-

tive industry with companies like General Motors, CTS Corporation, and Delphi Electronics, mostly in the Flint area.

Finally, Matt got into his first love, restoring antique cars. He was known throughout the country for his expertise in Jaguar and Triumph vehicles. His 1963 Jaguar XKE was ranked #1 in North America in JCNA concours competitions. He loaned the car to the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum in Auburn, Indiana, where many of us visited it on the 2020 JAGM fall drive.

Matt also worked at the H.I.S. ministries and was active in his local church. He is survived by his father Curtis (Gloria), brother Jonathan (Kimberly), and sister Margaret Cahill.
