

cult to for her to sell her beloved BRG Jaguar and she missed driving and being independent (she and her Jag are shown on the cover page). Prior to her retirement, Barbara was a Realtor at Re/Max and she enjoyed driving clients around in her Jag in search of potential properties. During that time, Barbara was a loyal member of the SAJC for many years and even held the office of Treasurer for two years.

Harbara was always very dedicated and caring of her family and friends. She was firm and confident in her views and knew exactly how she wanted things to go. When she lived at the Retirement Community, there were periodic corporate meetings for the tenants. At the last meeting Barbara attended, she stood up and spoke for the elderly who couldn't speak for themselves. She told the panel that they needed to change the food being served from Comfort food to a more Healthy diet. She sure was adamant about that! A few weeks later, she was diagnosed with Leukemia and spent the remainder of her life with her daughter and son-in-law in Inez, TX, where she passed away peacefully. Barbara was my dear friend and I truly miss her very much; may she rest in peace and her memory live on within us.

Treasurer's Report: SAJC Treasurer Robert Clemons reported the Club balance number as \$5.374.66.

OLD BUSINESS

Utopia Lunch Tour on July 10th to the Laurel Tree Inn - Meeting point was the Starbucks in The Rim with a departure for Utopia at 10AM, which worked out well. We were 22 people and had only a little trouble getting all off on TX 46 in Boerne. Weather was good, and no rain was encountered other than a few sprinkles, despite the recent heavy rains.

Luckenbach Rally 2021 – . Most important, an SAJC member was the event OVERALL WINNER! New members Crystale Cruz and her whole family won in an I-PACE no less, on their very first JCNA T2 time, speed, and distance rally. They, and their three daughters, all attended this meeting to be presented the Blake Lambert Trophy. It was our fourth attempt, July 17th, and 19 cars entered the event. There was a problem with more traffic than expected at checkpoint 3. We owe special thanks and apologies to Janet Martin and John Sullivan that were working that checkpoint, and to the participants that did not complain about traffic jams that caused us to discard stages 3 and 4. The starting point was Rudy's BBQ in Leon Springs and we thanked checkpoint workers Bill and Destiny Davis, Janet and John, and Paula Blackwell. Thanks to Steve Collins also with registration assistance, and to John Sullivan for taking care of, and paying for, the trophy update and replacement of one trophy that was dropped. I reported that, while the heat took out my notebook just after scoring, the preliminary results announced at Luckenbach survived a post event review. Scores were circulated at the meeting, and are posted on the club website and have been entered on jcna.com.

There will be a massive set of changes for 2022. Steve Collins has volunteered to be an apprentice Judge and begin the training.

Christmas Party Date and Location - Fran has reserved Club Giraud for December 18th. Please mark your calendars.




