October 9 - Italian Day Parade

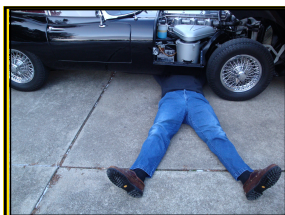

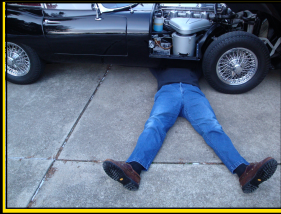


I know it's only October but I want to alert you to the new and exciting opportunity coming to your email on November 1st. Our By-Laws ratified in March specify that the Officers and Board of Directors of JCOP for the following year will be elected by the general membership in November. For the first time, we will be using online voting software named Election Buddy to accomplish this vote. This is a secure, private service that allots one vote to each JCNA membership number and automatically tabulates the results for each candidate on the ballot. You will receive an email on November 1st with an embedded, proprietary link to our voting site. Just click on that link and the ballot will open with explicit yet simple voting instructions. For single candidates running unopposed for an office you will be able to vote "Yes", "No" or "Abstain". For the six Board positions you will have the opportunity to either vote for up to six candidates, casting one vote for each of your choices, or abstain completely from voting for any of the candidates. At this time, we only have six candidates for the six Board member positions. If we have more candidates express interest in running before November 1st, you will still only vote for the six candidates you prefer. The six candidates with the greatest number of votes will be elected to the Board. The voting for candidates for the Associate Board positions will use the same process. We may not have any contested positions in this year's election, but the use of Election Buddy to register and automatically count the votes of the membership will validate its effectiveness for future elections where multiple candidates may be running for the same office. This software provides an easy and straightforward opportunity for all members of JCOP to voice their support for the candidates that the Nominating Committee has recommended for the leadership of our club. I sincerely hope you will embrace this new approach to voting when it appears in your inbox in November.

Moving on to another subject, I tried to summarize the significant discussions and decisions from the August AGM in last month's Jargon. There was an additional topic covered in one of the Saturday afternoon seminars that should be of interest to us here at JCOP. JCNA is studying various approaches to optimize the use of social media for both communication among existing members and the potential to increase membership. Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and other sites are certainly popular platforms among millions of users and they are being investigated to determine the potential benefits to JCNA. We at JCOP have been, shall we say, reluctant to embrace social media but perhaps this is something we should consider. Becoming functional as a club in these various programs would require someone who is both skilled in their operation and motivated to manage their usage. That someone is clearly not me. I have never been on Facebook, Twitter or any of these social media sites. I am not familiar with their respective intents and capabilities. But I have to acknowledge that their widespread popularity noted above must clearly provide some tangible benefits for their respective subscribers. If there are JCOP members out there who are proficient with these programs and can foresee the value they may provide for us, the Board would certainly welcome your input on their viability for our club. If this sounds like something you would be excited to pursue, please give this some serious consideration and contact a Board member to share your thoughts. As a club, we should at least be willing to make an informed and intelligent decision on how to best utilize social media for our benefit.

There you have it: Online voting and social media. Could it be that JCOP is ready for the 21st century?

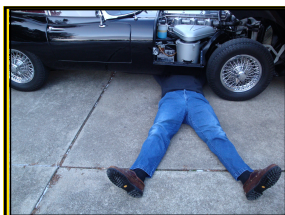


JCOP SHINES AT SOGGY BENTLEY PITTSBURGH CAR SHOW

Coventry Corner

As many members of JCOP are now well aware, the Coventry Foundation was formed some years ago to be the primary source for information and materials related to the heritage of Jaguar Cars in North America. It has been approved by the Internal Revenue Service as an approved Charitable Organization pursuant to Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Gary Kincel of JCOP is the Chairman of the Board of the Coventry Foundation. Your Liaison wishes to share a special experience he and Dave Gamret (President of JCOP) enjoyed when they got to spend a day “up and close” visiting the Coventry Foundation on Friday, August 27, 2021 along with other attendees to the Jaguar Clubs of North America Annual General Meeting in Columbia, South Carolina that weekend. Specifically, we got to spend well over an hour sitting at a table “shooting the breeze” and bench racing with Bob Tullius. Now Bob Tullius does not need any introduction to anyone who has familiarity with British Sports cars (including Jaguars), racing of many kinds, and air shows featuring high performance aircraft. But in a somewhat abbreviated summary fashion:

Bob Tullius commenced his auto racing career in 1961 driving Triumphs. In 1963 Bob Tullius became a professional race driver and became the principal driver for Kas Kastner, Triumph's North American Competition Directors. HE appeared for the first time at the 12 Hours of Sebring in 1963 and would win six SCCA Championship races in the factory TR4. In 1965 Bob Tullius formed the famous Group 44 Incorporated Race Team where he not only was one of the drivers but owned and operated the racing team. As summarized in Wikipedia, Group 44 developed a three-pronged approach to their business. They raced their own cars, built racing cars for paying customers, and ran an extensive marketing and sponsoring department for vehicle manufacturers and racing teams. The company settled on a color scheme of white cars with one or more green stripes (and occasionally some black stripes as well). The cars were not only well prepared, but immaculately presented. Many experts say Bob Tullius was the first racer who realized the importance to his sponsors of having his race cars not only run so well but look perfectly and Bob hosted his sponsors at every race, spending time with them and showing his appreciation for their financial support in addition to being so successful on the track with podium finishes. The team used a unique articulated transporter painted in team colors to ferry their cars between races. In doing all of this and putting his sponsors “front and center” many cognoscenti say Bob was really Roger Penske before Roger Penske.

Group 44 is exclusively associated with British vehicles, initially fielding Triumph TRs and Spitfires and later campaigning models from MG and Jaguar. When Group 44 entered two Jaguar XJR-5 cars in the 1984 24 Hours of Le Mans, it was the first time a Jaguar had raced at Le Mans in 27 years. When Group 44 cars traveled to an event their cars would be displayed at the local British Leyland dealers and the team would be promoted through local media. For a time almost all of British Leyland's marketing in the United States went through Group 44.

The Group 44 team won 14 national SCCA championships and three Trans Am titles. Among the more than 300 race victories there are also eleven successes in IMSA GTP championship races. Bob Tullius also personally raced cars from a wide range of manufacturers, including Alpine, AMC, Chevrolet, Dodge, Oldsmobile, Plymouth, Porsche, Ferrari, and Ford.

Bob Tullius drove competitively until 1986, retiring after his final win at the 24 Hours of Daytona. He appeared in no fewer than 252 races, winning 38 and posting 43 class wins. In 1965 and 1975 he won the overall standings of the SCCA Championships (in 1975 the team raced V-12 E-Types) and in 1977 and 1978, the overall ratings of the category I of the Trans Am Series. Bob Tullius and Group 44 however continued their successful involvement with Jaguar, first in the XJS, and later with the specially-built XJR sports racing cars which in the 1980s contested the American IMSA races, and brought Jaguar back to Le Mans. In the 1983 IMSA GTP series he finished in second place behind Al Holbert. Three times he was on the pole of the 24 Hours of Le Mans, where he also won the 1985 GTP class for Jaguar with a 13th-place finish. When Bob left the Triumph works team run by Kas Kastner, Bob became a competitor to this team both as a driver and team owner. Bob's success and accomplishments speak for themselves since Kas Kastner became famous as a Hall of Fame builder and tuner and driver of race cars and Bob and Kas had teams that competed against each other, especially with Triumphs.

After retiring from auto racing, Bob Tullius pursued his interest in aviation, becoming a World War II airplane enthusiast, and participating in many air shows. Bob donated his WWII Mustang P-51D fighter to the Royal Air Force Museum in England but only after having the entire plane taken down to the metal and repainted to be perfectly accurate to when it was in service in the war (very few, if any, would have known there was but a minor paint error before doing this restoration but Bob knew so he made it perfect before his donation was delivered to England). Bob has a personal hanger at the airport in Sebring, Florida which has held his aircraft,

and still contains aircraft he has piloted along with the last TR6 and last TR8 built by British Leyland. Some Group 44 race cars are there as well. Gary Kincel has visited Bob a number of times in Sebring and considers Bob a personal friend. Bob has logged thousands and thousands of hour of time as a pilot and is widely recognized as being as expert a pilot of aircraft as he was a pilot of race cars.



Among so many other honors, Bob Tullius was inducted into the Sebring Hall of Fame in 2014. He became a member of the SCCA Hall of Fame in 2015. He entered the British Sports Car Hall of Fame in 2017. And in 2018, he was inducted into the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America.



Bob Tullius has been a strong supporter of the Coventry Foundation and has been the Expert Advisor on the Board of Directors. On August 27, 2021 Bob – along with Mike and Mary Dale – toured the Coventry Foundation premises during the JCNA Annual General Meeting and Bob was most impressed with being able to see, and touch, everything the Foundation has continued to achieve.

During the significant time Dave Gamret and I got to spend with Bob, Bob was willing to answer practically any and every question we posed to him. While we, and he, are not getting any younger, Bob is as sharp as a tack and has an amazing memory of people, places, races, race cars, and airplanes so it was clear why Bob has always been a perfectionist in what he did and stands for. Bob was honest with us but down to earth, a most accomplished man in so many regards that handled compliments with finding some angle where he could poke fun at himself, and when we were with him all his attention was focused on us (and his remembering our names and addressing us by our first names) such that it was easy to see why Bob is so revered by so many people. We enjoyed hearing story and after story of racing and other escapades. While Bob is in so many Halls of Fame for his being a race car driver, Group 44 race car team owner, and airplane pilot, at the end of the day Dave Gamret and I walked away concluding we had been honored to spend time with a Hall of Fame person.
