EDGING IT

President's Article by Brian Blackwell—Jan-Feb 2022

With a new year comes new challenges, and opportunities. The end of 2021 came here with a pretty alarming news conference from the mayor and county judge, along with University Health, about trying to prevent overcrowding in the hospitals due to the coronavirus. As someone who would like to go to a hospital, and get in if I needed one, we all need to listen to and heed their requests for steps to reduce the spread of infection and keep people out of the hospital.

This latest omicron variant is contagious enough to raise the risk level in Bexar County to 'SEVERE', from 'SLIGHT', just before Christmas. Positivity rates on tests also went from 2% to 27% in almost as short a period. I do not intend to call for any indoor club activities with the metrics at those levels. If you want to organize some, please just send me an email or a text so we can publish that it is happening. That being said, we are going to schedule activities that can be done outdoors. Some members have also suggested to me that we should ask that everyone that comes to indoor activities be fully vaccinated, which is all that we can do, as the governor of this state likes to issue orders and pass laws against more.

The ebb and flow of the variants so far has provided windows of opportunity to undertake more risky activities with lower potential of getting ourselves sick, and we will try to make things happen in those windows. We may postpone and reschedule some events this year. The first event is the 33rd Annual Rallye to Luckenbach, scheduled for January 29th, and will be an outdoors activity. Start point will be at a place with a lot of outdoor seating for lunch, and everything else happens outside. Checkpoints will be in parks, or places we have used for many years and not had issues with like last year. Only inclement weather is likely to stop us, or lack of checkpoint workers. We do still need a few volunteers.

Even the federal government is now signaling that we are going to have to learn to live with the coronavirus for the near, and possibly prolonged, future. Of course, everyone has to assess their personal health situation and decide for themselves how and what activities they want to take on. I know that I have postponed some more risky behaviors, like motorcycle riding, based on the desire to avoid possibly having to visit any hospitals. That moratorium has been going on for the last two years, but if I was more into motorcycle riding, I would have found a way to do it with less risk.

January is also the time for everyone to renew their memberships. We are going to reach out this year to members of the recent past who may not have renewed for reasons of the coronavirus. The tools that exist now for controlling or fighting the virus are far better than in 2021. Between getting vaccinated and boosted, better tests, and new antiviral drugs, we are going to have to learn to live and cope with this disease, or set of diseases. 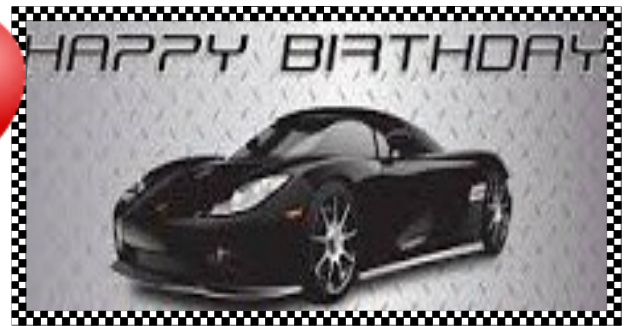

Changes to the 2022 Jaguar Models by Chris Teague—Dec.13, 2021

Changes to the 2022 Jaguar Models

Chris Teague | Dec 13, 2021

[Jaguar](#) is a storied automaker with decades of history building gorgeous, powerful vehicles. Even its [SUVs](#) are eye candy, though the eye-catching style hasn't been enough to boost Jaguar to anywhere near the popularity levels of its rivals from elsewhere in Europe.



Jaguar's product catalog for 2022 is slightly smaller than in years past due to the discontinuation of the [XE](#) sedan. That leaves the automaker with one [sedan](#) model—the [XF](#)—on sale for 2022 as it prepares for the rollout of an all-electric [XJ](#) sedan soon, doubling the number of electric-vehicle ([EV](#)) models Jaguar makes.

2022 Jaguar E-Pace Changes

Jaguar heavily refreshed the [E-Pace](#) in 2021. Armed with a new front fascia and lighting, a revised touchscreen, and brand-new infotainment software, the E-Pace didn't need any revisions to stay fresh heading into 2022. The previous model's [turbocharged](#) 2.0-liter base engine makes 246 horsepower, and in the top E-Pace 300 Sport trim, it produces 296 ponies.

2022 Jaguar F-Pace Changes

Similar to the E-Pace, Jaguar made significant changes to the [F-Pace](#) in 2021. Updates included revised exterior styling, new infotainment, and new tech. As a result, there are no critical updates for 2022. The previous model year's powertrains, features, and options are still in place. That means the base engine remains a turbocharged 2.0-liter 4-cylinder with 246 hp. The F-Pace S P340 steps up to a turbocharged and supercharged 3.0-liter 6-cylinder engine with a mild-hybrid system that makes 335 hp. The P400 model gets 395 hp from the same powertrain, and the range-topping SVR trim gets a supercharged V8 with 542 hp.

2022 Jaguar I-Pace Changes

Jaguar skipped the 2021 model year with its first all-electric vehicle, but the [I-Pace crossover](#) rolls into 2022 with some notable changes. One of the most important is an update to the vehicle's onboard charging system, which is now 11 kW, up from 7 kW, for more rapid charging at home. Jaguar says that change cuts charging time from 12.6 hours to 8.6 hours. The I-Pace also comes with a no-cost 4G LTE data plan, wireless smartphone charging, and a surround-view camera system for the new model year.

2022 Jaguar F-Type Changes

Jaguar remains committed to the F-Type sports car, as evidenced by its move to give the entire lineup a supercharged V8. The base model for 2022 is the F-Type P450, which comes with a supercharged V8 making 444 hp. Rear- (RWD) and all-wheel drive (AWD) are available, and the P450's powertrain is strong enough to propel it from zero-to-60 mph from a standstill in a claimed 4.4 seconds.

The F-Type R's supercharged mill produces 575 hp and sends that power to all four wheels. Jaguar says that acceleration to 60 mph takes just 3.5 seconds, and the car features an electronically limited top speed of 186 mph.

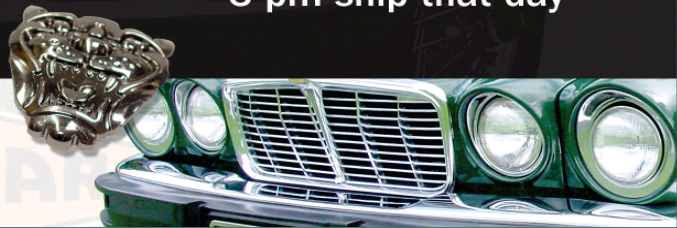

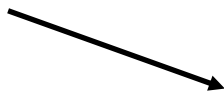
