# **Cat Tales**

This month's "Cat Tales" comes to us from SDJC President Dan Jensen who's helping to keep our classic Jaguars on the road with new owners.

## Two Calls to SDJC – Two New Jaguar Owners

**Over the years** as an SDJC member, I've received numerous calls from people interested in repairing and maintaining their Jaguars, or purchasing a special Jag. Recently, two e-mails arrived asking for input on local Jaguars that were for sale. The first was in early November from Steve Hagan, who was interested in a Mark II for the car-show season in New Hampshire where he resides in the summers. He had spotted a 1967 340 at Classic Showcase in Oceanside and noted "they seem to be Jaguar specialists." For those of us in SDJC, we know that Tom Krefetz, long-time SDJC member and owner of Classic Showcase, is indeed a specialist in Jaguars. I looked at the Classic Showcase website and quickly saw the car. Steve was right - it was stunning.





Based on Steve's comment that he was a long -term Jaguar fan, his knowledge of Mark IIs, and his obvious appreciation for vintage cars (see his 1954 Mercury wagon), I offered to do something I had not done for a long time: look at a car based on e-mails from a potential buyer. Upon agreeing to do so, Steve expressed his appreciation and provided a detailed list of what he would like examined.

My office is ~30 minutes from Classic Showcase in Oceanside, so I took a short drive on a lunch hour after setting up an appointment with Becky at Classic Showcase. When I arrived, the car was positioned ready to be raised on a lift and Tom was there to provide insight into the car.



The car looked terrific, and I asked Tom if he had recently detailed the car. His response was "Nothing other than making sure it is clean." The previous owner obviously took very good care of the car. Tom and I first examined the interior and exterior. The interior was a bright red that was a great compliment to the glossy black paint.

Steve was particularly concerned that the car have no rust or corrosion and listed areas where we should take a close look. Tom raised the car on the lift and we looked at all the hardware and points of concern that Steve highlighted. I have owned and been underneath three of my former Jaguars that were manufactured before Ford bought Jaguar in 1989. From that point of view, I have some experience as to what to look for. The underside was free of oil leaks and there was no rust to be seen, likely reflecting its life in California.



After Tom took a close look at details, including deciding who was the manufacturer of the exterior mirror, we decided it was time for a drive. I opted to let him do this so I could watch the gauges, listen to the engine and gearbox, and monitor other details that Steve requested (e.g., oil pressure). Once we hit the road, it was clear this was a quick car with 3.8L engine and 4-speed manual transmission. On impulse, I called Steve as we drove and let him listen in to my running commentary on performance, handling, gauge readings, etc. After the ~15-minute drive, I told Steve I could see no reason why the car wouldn't be a great addition to car shows as well as fun to drive. I was sure the car would attract many looks and thumbs up while on the road. I provided a variety of pictures to him that evening, who later stated he planned to make an offer.

A few weeks later, both Tom and Steve confirmed that Steve had purchased the car. By the end of the month, the car was in New Hampshire and even had New Hampshire plates!

This is what I call a "Win Win Win." Tom sold a vintage Jag to an owner who will maintain it as did the former owner. Steve has a beautiful Mark II that meets his expectations and will be an eye catcher on the road and at shows. And I had a blast!



About mid-month, I received a second e-mail requesting advice about the purchase of a local car for sale. Joowan Lee, a resident of Del Mar, was interested in a 1960 XK150 FHC, which also by chance had a stunning red interior. Knowing I would be way out of my area of expertise, I asked Dick Cavicke if he would be willing to look at the car. Dick is a long-time member of SDJC, was the Concours Chief Judge for both SDJC and JCNA for many years, and has owned two XK 120s. As such, he understands details about XKs that I have no knowledge of. He graciously agreed to the request for help, and he and Joowan gave the car a close review. The result is Joowan purchased the car and became a member of SDJC as well! Joowan was very appreciative of Dick's help, as am I. I'm looking forward to seeing the car on an upcoming SDJC drive.

Recently I published a Coventry Foundation (CF) Tutorial in Jaguar Tracks. Now it's time to report on the latest news from Coventry Foundation West (CFW). I am extremely happy to report CFW has received two supplementary vehicle donations. In addition to Steve and Cindi Kirby's majestic 1965 Black Mark X, we now have received, from Washington State, Craig Mendenhall's Mark II. Also received from an anonymous donor is a beautiful, tastefully modified Mark V DHC also now housed at CFW!





#### As a Reminder - CF Main Goals:

- Preserve Jaguar History
- Provide technical information for all Jaguar cars from pre-WWII to today's modern models. The archives for both locations (Columbia, SC and Oceanside, CA) include manuals, brochures, magazines, Jaguar-related books, sales brochures, and parts catalogs.
- Tool Loan Program Tools are available to JCNA members, as well as qualified Jaguar repair and restoration shops. If you are interested in a tool for loan, visit the JCNA website, click on Tool Loan and research the list of tools available. Use the tool loan form to submit your request. The only cost is a small deposit by a credit card and the cost of shipping and insurance. That's much cheaper than buying the tool even if you can locate one for sale! As an additional advantage, if the tool is available in the Oceanside facility, no shipping is required after your order the tool, just drive to Classic Showcase, to pick it up, and return when you are finished.
- Individual research projects using research library archives in either the Columbia or Oceanside location. Foundation Research Materials can be loaned out to SDJC/JCNA members - just contact George Camp (<u>scjag@juno.com</u>) with your specific information request, subject, car VIN #, etc. As a reminder, CF does not produce Jaguar Heritage Trust Certificates. Those may be obtained through Jaguar Land Rover, UK.
- The Foundation sponsors and awards an annual scholarship to a deserving graduate of the automobile restoration program at Pennsylvania College of Technology.

It would be an asset to continue to have this unique facility available in our area for the use of all our members.

# New Mid-Engined 2022 Jaguar F-Type to rival McLaren

Jaguar F-Type successor, which could be called J-Type, will feature a mid-engine layout and hybrid tech. A full EV model could also follow.



The successor to the Jaguar F-Type will embrace hybrid technology and go mid-engined when it launches around 2022, Auto Express can exclusively reveal. And further down the line, Jag could launch a fully-electric version to rival the forthcoming Porsche Taycan.

Development work on the F-Type's successor is under way, with engineers devising a plan that will transform the model into the brand's halo product to compete with McLaren and Audi Sport.

Central to the plan and favoured by engineers is the shift from a front to mid-engined layout for the performance car. According to high-ranking technicians working on the project, the Honda NSX is being used as a benchmark for the next-generation Jaguar model, because key to the car's armoury will be the use of hybrid technology to boost performance.

Although it will be a replacement for the current F-Type, the new product is likely to bear little resemblance to the existing car. The switch to a mid-engined layout will enable Jaguar to be more daring with the proportions; the long bonnet and cab- rearward design of the current F-Type will make way for a lower, sleeker overall look, previewed in our exclusive images.



The mechanical make-up of the car is yet to be finalised, but it's expected that at least two electric motors, one on each axle to give four-wheel drive, will supplement a mid-mounted V6 engine. If it is to be competitive, a power figure upwards of 550bhp is likely, placing it among competitors such as the McLaren 570S and Audi R8.

It will be only the second mid-engined car in Jaguar's 83-year history, following on from the XJ220 of the nineties. The firm came close to launching another in 2010 with the C-X75. Developed with Williams Advanced Engineering, the supercar was pitched as a rival for the McLaren P1, but the economic situation at the time concerned Jaguar and the project was axed due to a fear of a lack of return on the company's investment.

The flexible platform on which the new F-Type will be based will also allow the brand to develop a fully-electric version. Auto Express understands engineers are keeping a close eye on the Taycan project and are keen to build a rival for that car.

Jaguar has much more experience recently with developing electric cars as opposed to mid-engined vehicles. The I-Pace is widely regarded as the best of its kind and is driven by concentric permanent magnet synchronous motors – that means the car's driveshaft runs through the middle of them – which are designed and built by Jaguar itself.

It's also possible that by the time the F-Type EV arrives, solid state battery technology, which is being analysed and developed by a host of global car brands, could be ready for production.

Given the extensive changes the F-Type's successor will undergo, it's possible Jaguar could rename the model J-Type. The firm applied to trademark the name as recently as last month.
