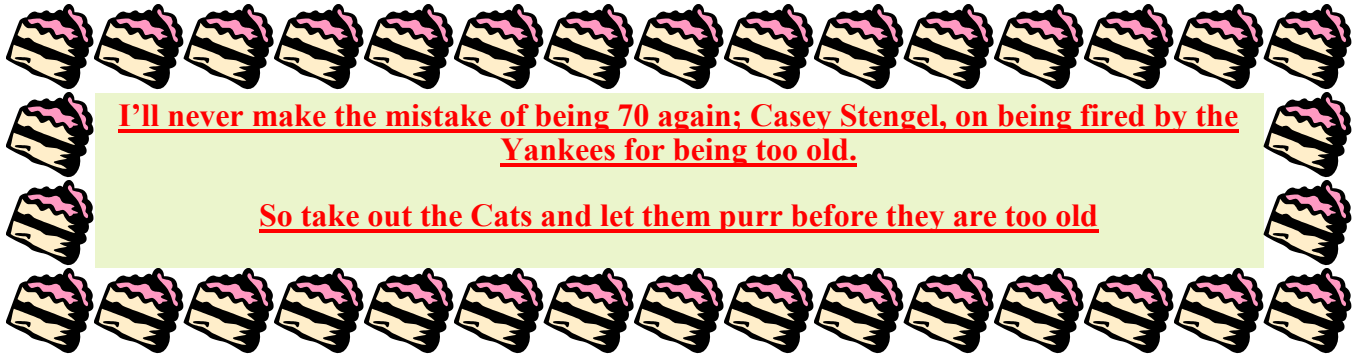

Rocker panel

Centuries ago, many horse-drawn carriages had rounded lower sections to prevent snagging. According to “A Practical Treatise on Coach-building” from 1881, this design was also rumored to be more appealing to the eye, thus giving the overall shape of the carriage an outline that resembled that of a child’s rocking cradle. Many of these carriages were suspended by a series of straps and ropes to help make rides more comfortable (primitive suspension if you will), and these suspended cabins would rock back and forth on a journey.
