EDGING IT

President's Article by Brian Blackwell—Mar-Apr, 2022

May 2022

Having worked 31 of my 34 years in the military industrial complex assigned to a field office halfway across the country from the 'headquarters', trips back to same were the only chance you had to recharge your batteries in company capabilities and technology. As where I worked had always had a depiction of the American Bald Eagle on its logo, it was customary at the company to call these trips back to the home office as your chance to get your 'eagle shot'. Over the years, I have also come to think of the Jaguar Clubs of North America Annual General Meeting as the 'Jaguar shot'. A chance to learn what the Jaguar Cars company had done, and what they would be doing in the future, a presentation of what other clubs were doing, and how the overall membership, finance, and the various programs of JCNA worked and were performing were all presented. You also typically get to go see the nice car museums and collections around the country, especially if they are Jaguar related.

This year's event was held in Milwaukee in late March, and while not as balmy as desirable, only a little frozen water fell, but not in enough quantity to effect travel. SAJC had two delegates at this year's AGM, as Susan McCool volunteered to be a delegate also. The involvement of some of the Wisconsin Jaguars Ltd. Club members in Elkhart Lake provided the opportunity to learn some more about the vintage racing at a Friday afternoon event. Their guest speaker was Brian Sheridan, who had worked as an engine builder for Jaguar and Tom Walkinshaw Racing in the Silk Cut Jaguar LeMans prototype endurance world championship. Susan attended LeMans that year, and tried to talk to Brian Sheridan, but he never made enough time to talk to her very much.

The event this year was typical of most, with the most notable exception that there was only a verbal report from Jaguar Land Rover North America. Their representative said everyone at JLR was doing three jobs, and it was difficult at times to find out who is doing what. He said Production was down due to semiconductor shortages, but not as much as many other makers. There was no talk of JLR becoming a 'boutique' bespoke automaker at the AGM, but Jaguar World keeps up with stories of new developments that sound like they are going in that direction. About the most significant thing new at the AGM this year, is that you are going to be able to start getting your Jaguar Journals electronically if you so desire, but it is going to be either hardcopy or electronic, not both. I have not been able to make the electronic work for me yet, and I will share how to do it when I am sure it works. Our friends in Mexico have not gotten one in their mail system, so they tell me, in years, and this will work for them hopefully.

Conversion to electric vehicles certainly appears to be their driving force for the future, as JLR is making strides to be the leader in the conversion. Recent Jaguar World magazine articles show that they already lead all manufacturers in the UK and Europe, in percentage of electric vehicles of their total sales. A recent article in JCNA's Jaguar Journal described new engine options, including an in line six cylinder-hybrid electric drivetrain available in new F-Pace. A four cylinder supercharged engine at 245HP, or this rather complex sounding in line six-hybrid at a combined 391HP. I have since learned there is an in line six option with no hybrid electric at 336HP.

After a two year hiatus due to the pandemic, Club Jaguar Mexico returned to the show field with their 34th Concourso Internacional de Elegancia' at Huixquilucan, about 30 miles outside Mexico City on April 2-3. A two day event organized and created by Club Jaguar Mexico, the show includes cars from all other interested marques, too numerous to list. Your Club President and Chief Judge has been invited to come judge at this event periodically over the last 13 years. Paula Blackwell has often attended and done scoresheet scrutineering with Alejandro Isoard of CJM as well, but only Brian went this year. I was apprehensive due to COVID -19 myself, but was able to get my second booster shot a few days before I left.

Every bit as large as the Jaguar Club area was the Porsche, Mercedes Benz, and Ford Mustang clubs. After each club has its individual show and judging, the club winner is moved to the Corral of Champions for an overall Best of Show competition for the American and European car. Winner of the Best American car was a 1950's Packard, and the Best European Car was a 1939 Horch (Autounion) Phaeton.
