If you want to go at you own time and pace, feel free to do so. The last trip several people stopped at an aeronautical museum and or automobile museum. You may have to look them up on the internet if you're not familiar with them.

Lunch is any place you'd like to stop. There are places like McDonalds along the interstate or you can stop at any one of several towns along the way such as Wichita, Eldorado or Emporia Kansas. There are several fine museums to visit such as the WWI Museum & Memorial. It's the only WWI museum in the country. Another option is the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum and/or the American Jazz Museum. They are both located at the same address and tickets are available separately or as a combo. Saturday night we will meet in the lobby at 6:30 pm to caravan to Lidia's Italian Restaurant. We have reservations at 7:00.
