We had our first Board of Directors meeting on January 22 and every Director and Officer is excited about what 2023 holds in the way of events. While efforts are undergoing to firm up dates and reservations, we depend on some third parties that just are not ready to have issued their schedules but JCOP nevertheless in still proceeding to schedule activities even if some are "in pencil" right now.

We are hopeful that Dave Gamret will get enough RSVPs to pull off our getting to learn how to "curl" on the ice at the Pittsburgh Curling Club on February 4. We will then want to follow up afterwards and travel to the Sewickley Hotel for some eating and libations (the Sewickley Hotel is not only a really tasty place to eat but they were a sponsor for our 2022 JCOP Sewickley Car Show).

JCOP intends to have a "Tech Session" in the spring that hopefully will be as educational, and enjoyable, as the one Dan Fowler provided us last year at FAST Company in Glenshaw, PA. We likely will be hosted this spring by Gary Kincel at his garage in White Oak, PA. Details are being worked out to do this in March or April.

With Ken Como's XK120 coming along in restoration at Hahn Auto Restoration in Harmony, PA, the idea has been floated of having Rich Aronson bring his XJ120 there and comparing the cars since Ken shares that his XK seems to not have standard measurements. This might be an enjoyable Saturday morning followed by lunch at the Harmony Inn.

Mike Zappa is awaiting the Gateway Clipper Fleet announcing when they will hold "Prom Night' this year. For a small charge like \$15 per person one dresses up in their finery and comes and takes a cruise. For an additional charge you get a professional photograph taken of you in a lovely spot. While gourmet food is not available on board the boat and it is more like one can purchase ballpark food on board, arrangements might be made to meet for dinner at the Grand Concourse or somewhere else at Station Square before taking the cruise.

The JCOP picnic at North Park will be on Sunday, May 21, 2023 at the Roosevelt Shelter where it was held last year. By popular demand, the same arrangements will be made for food and drink that everyone said they enjoyed in 2022. Mark your calendars. Mike & Beth Zappa and Stu & Ruth Benson will again be the hosts and making all arrangements. We have assigned "Mr. Weather" – Dave Gamret – to arrange good weather for enjoyment by all.

June promises to hold at least two sanctioned JCOP events. The Veterans' Car Show at the Southwestern Veterans Center is being moved – at the request of the Veterans Center – to June and Tom and Lynne Nuhfer are going to again chair this event. The veterans want to see a wider range of vehicles than just Jaguars so efforts will be made to recruit other car clubs as well as our members *Continued on next page*





bringing some other cars of interest they might own. Amanda Lawson is going to reprise the Mountain Playhouse Theater event with the cruise, lunch, and then seeing a play. She intends to arrange this in June (with some other car clubs being invited but JCOP getting top billing like Scott Drab always did) and she thinks she may also do one of these events in August as well if the demand is there and everyone cannot come in June. Tom Nuhfer and Amanda Lawson are in the process of working together to coordinate dates in June so each event is sufficiently apart in time from the other. Amanda shares that the Mountain Playhouse Theater has not yet scheduled their plays for the summer so they need to await such being announced.

JCOP wants to offer as many "driving events" as possible whether it be a cruise to nowhere, to a destination, having a meal involved in the cruise or whatever. John Putzier has arranged very enjoyable day trips the last couple years and likely will do so this year as well. We solicit the willingness of JCOP members to plan and schedule such a drive. If interested, please talk to me and Rich Aronson (Rich is in charge of the Activities schedule). But this year we are looking forward to partnering with other car clubs and car events so we can enjoy such driving even if arranged by – for example – the Steel Town Corvette Club or the MG or Triumph Clubs or one of the clubs Chris Davis heads up (Rolls-Royce/Bentley and Cadillac/LaSalle clubs) or the West Penn Miata Club or the Western PA Chapter of the Ferrari Club of America (headed up by Marc Buzzelli) or even some entity having a charitable fundraiser where driving on a tour is involved. If you are a member of any such other club and see they are having an event that looks like fun, ask them about allowing JCOP to piggyback on their event and we can then reciprocate. The more, the merrier, as they say. And your Directors and Officers have so said!

JCOP members always turn out en mass for the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix events in the multiweek period in July where they are held leading up to the Schenley Park PVGP this year on Saturday/Sunday July 22 & 23 where the British cars all park together on the golf course if one signs up ahead of time and purchases the weekend parking admission pass.

The Sewickley Car Show is going to reprise on August 12, 2023 on Broad Street in Sewickley, PA and again will be open not only to JCOP vehicles but other marques of quality and interest. We intend to fill up all the spaces on Broad Street this year that we can safely utilize with Show Chair Chuck Pipich running the event and determining what vehicles are "admissible" per the standards of the show. And on August 26, 2023 the ever-popular Jaguars at Jacksons dinner – following an hour of socializing in the parking lot with everyone's cars – is on the books.

Bryan Williams, the JCOP Chief Judge for our annual Concours, will be firming up a date in September in the near future for this always-enjoyable morning at the Fox Chapel Yacht Club with a luncheon to follow at the restaurant literally at the edge of the Allegheny River.





A plan is in place to try to again hold British Cars at Hartwood by the Mansion at Hartwood Acres in later September or early October once we know when our JCOP Concours will be held. Mike Zappa and I are following up with efforts to obtain permission from the County of Allegheny. If this is successful, Jack Terrick will chair the event as he has done spectacularly for many years where funds were raised for the Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank.

The Fall Leaf Tour is always a big hit as arranged and conducted by Pete Galinowski in October. And our Holiday Party is always a most enjoyable success. The Board of Directors is going to invite the major sponsors of JCOP to attend the Holiday party gratis as well as sharing invitations for them to participate in our other events.

Dolly Taskey, with the full support of the Board of Directors, is starting a "JCOP Lunchbox" event where, once each month, a member will be tasked with arranging reservations for our members and friends to just come and have lunch together in a purely social setting. No agenda, just food and fun. Dolly intends to try to get folks to do these each month, most likely during the work week but perhaps occasionally on a weekend, and rotate the location each month so at least one or two times those members of ours that live far and wide away from Pittsburgh can have the ability to enjoy lunch without having to drive too far.

Mike Zappa is considering arranging a JCOP Rally to Lake Chautauqua, NY where we would tour back roads up to Bemis Point and then have a picnic at his lake house. This would be a nice, scenic drive that is not too far such that one could easily enough come back home afterwards if they did not want to stay over for the night at one of the many lodging locations by the lake. Pending the scheduling of other events, this event is "to be determined".

Every year a group of JCOP members goes up to Watkins Glen for the racing. While not a formal JCOP event, they all drive their Jaguars including a number of E-Types. Jack Terrick has agreed to be a coordinator of information if anyone else is interested in going there. Mike Zappa races there each year. This year he is building a 1966 TVR race car and while not finished, it is a work of art so far (just like all the race cars are that both he and his son, Chris, build).

Our sponsors from Jaguar of Monroeville and Bobby Rahal Jaguar might have events at their locations where our participation is desired. Or we might enlist them to have events where they can educate our members on the current state and planned future of Jaguar North America vehicles so we can better understand what Jaguar means by saying they are committed to electrification. Just electric vehicles? Or hybrids? Any internal combustion engines at all ?? Time line for transition? Many JCOP members and friends have modern Jaguars of very recent vintage so this information is timely and needed.

This Month's Featured Member: Bill Cooper



Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix Rebrands, Reveals New Logo

Feb. 4 - "Learn to Curl" with the Pittsburgh Curling Club

The Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix is rebranding itself for 2023. PGVP Executive Director Daniel DelBianco announced, "The new logo features an open-wheel grand prix racer speeding over a red, white and blue flag. The car number is 83 – representing our founding in 1983. We are now the longest-running vintage race in the country."

Dan Holmes, PVGP creative director, designed the logo. "Dan has been the driving force behind our graphics and marketing materials, including event logos and posters, for nearly two decades. This new design adds a sense of exhilaration to the logo and rebrands us as the motorsport festival that we have become known for," said DelBianco. PVGP has grown into a national event with a 10-day motorsport festival and two race weekends (with events scheduled from July 9-23, 2023).

The PVGP started as a single day race in 1983. The event was born in Alan Patterson's Shadyside garage, and his red 1948 MG-TC appeared at the center of the logo and remained for 40 years. (The late Alan Patterson was a JCOP member.) Merchandise with the new logo will be available at the Pittsburgh International Auto Show to be held Feb. 17-20 at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center, downtown Pittsburgh.
