

The 2024 Jaguar F-Type May Be The End Of The Line For Jag's Gasoline Powered Sports Cars

They say "all good things must come to an end". And with that it seems Jaguar is saying goodbye to one of the most beautiful cars currently in production. Anywhere, period. While it may not be perfect the F-Type is powerful, more than fast enough, extremely road worthy and quite simply drop dead gorgeous.

There are few cars that match the muscular and commanding presence of the Coupe. The Convertible is perhaps a little less dramatic in appearance but it's curves and stance are lean and incredibly seductive. Introduced in 2014 the F-Type has carried Jaguars sports car legacy admirably and considering the brands racing heritage that is no easy feat.feat

All are powered by Jag's supercharged 5.0 litre V8 engines in 450hp and 575hp variants.

2024 marks the 75th anniversary of the Jaguar brand and quite possibly the automakers final farewell to internal combustion automobiles. Starting in 2025, Jaguar intends to go fully electric across it's range. Or so it seems as model updates or breaking news of any kind from the Jaguar head office have been few and far between. Perhaps supply chain issues or a hot selling F-Type 75 may extend the iconic sports car's shelf life?

In any case after 75 years of producing awe inspiring combustion-powered sports cars we can be certain that electrification is the brands future. For now though there still remains the opportunity to acquire a true and genuine Jaguar petrol powered sports car.

Some Canadian dealerships are still advertising in stock 2023 model availability and most are currently accepting orders on the 2024 F-Type. Considering the historic transition for the brand and the "last of the breed" nature of the F-Type 75 editions, it's safe to say that these 75th anniversary "Cats" will be highly collectible.







Concours d'Elegance A CPJC Event?

The Canadian Prairies Jaguar Club is still very much a new car club. As the CPJC enters its second year we find ourselves coming to grips with our vast geographical area as well as connecting to a growing and diverse membership with interests all over the automotive hobbyist map. These might be seen as challenges but as our Club President Doug Uffen will offer, "our geography and diverse membership present a great opportunity and will eventually prove to be our clubs greatest strength". I think Doug is on to something?



During our inaugural years events and again at a few of our "ZOOM" club meetings there has been some discussion on Car Shows, Club Competitions, Rally, Concours events and even Judging training opportunities. All worthwhile and legitimate pursuits for any car club.

Some CPJC members have expressed interest in exploring these type of opportunities and our club potentially hosting a signature Show & Shine /Concours d'Elegance event as early as 2024! We do have a club subject matter expert, Chris Hay, a certified and experienced JCNA Concours level Judge in our membership to keep us on track should such an event come to fruition.

JCNA and it's NW Region Clubs host several signature Concours events annually, and have a team of Chief Judges and Judging experts that are pro-active in helping anyone interested in volunteering or learning about Concours Judging opportunities.

Concours d'Elegance are events where prestigious and classic vehicles are displayed and judged. These events are often held in conjunction with automobile shows, racing events, charity fundraisers and even classic car auctions. *Concours* events are next level shows and are often by invitation with only the best cars competing for the trophies.

Historically vehicle judging at a *Concours* is more demanding than that of a local car show or show & shine event. Trained judges examine the vehicles thoroughly. Each and every component is rated and scored. Trophy class vehicles are considered perfect or very nearly so in every way. *Concours* quality cars are often presented in 'mint" condition with trophy winners regularly meeting or exceeding the standards of the cars as presented when they were brand new!

Car Shows & The Concours d'Elegance Difference

Car shows are a huge part of automotive culture. Car owners, hobbyists, driving enthusiasts and automobile lovers of every stripe can regularly be found at these events. Cars shows will generally have something for everyone, often featuring different types of cars in various stages of restoration and condition. Each car show defines it's own criteria and more often than not the focus is on having fun and enjoying the day. Trophies are a secondary consideration at most local car shows.

The Concours d'Elegance is a different event. These events are first and foremost a competition. The cars on display are all excellent examples of their marque and are presented for judging with points given or taken away based on condition. Even the smallest imperfections whether inside or out, can cost a competitor a point or even fraction of a point.

Competitors who enter a *Concours d'Elegance* do so for bragging rights and to earn recognition for their cars. Keeping a car up to *Concours* standards takes devotion of time, effort and most certainly considerable financial commitment. Owners of *Concours* winning cars can expect that the efforts required generally equate to higher valuation.

It should be noted that most events also have a "People's Choice" (fan favourite) award.

Judging a Concours d' Elegance / Judging Volunteers

No club could host a judged event such as a *Concours* without a team of trained and qualified judges. Obviously before the CPJC could successfully host a sanctioned event some ground work will need to be done. Beyond an organizing committee we will need Judges and judging volunteers. Fortunately for our club the JCNA NW Region has experience and is actively recruiting and supporting members interested in learning about or becoming Concours Judges and or judging volunteers.

Expect updates and feature columns in JCNA regional club newsletters and websites throughout 2023 addressing this topic / opportunity.

The road to becoming a *Concours* or *Championship* level judge will be a process. However it need not be as daunting as it may seem to someone who may have a notion. After all each journey starts somewhere and every car buff knows it's as much about the journey as it is the destination. The road there should be fun.

Ask any Chief Judge about the process and most will offer that simply volunteering to help out at an event was enough to pique their interest.



CPJC members that may be interested should know that no prior car judging experience is required to become a judging volunteer. The only requisite is that you should probably be a bit of car person. No need to be "mechanically inclined", though proficiency with a pencil will be an asset.

No such thing as "mistakes" in Judging, especially true at the volunteer level. Judging is a team effort and each judging team will have members with varying levels of expertise and competencies. Volunteers gain experience with each and every event. Judges School and level appropriate training is open to any JCNA club member. (benefits of membership!)
