

Club Members Trade in their Jags for a Blimp!

In January, Club members Terry Tilton and Barbie Lorentz were guests of Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company during an aerial trip on the Goodyear blimp, named *Wingfoot Two*. The Goodyear blimp is not available to the general public and is used for corporate guests. Discount Tire, a major buyer of Goodyear tires, donated two blimp passes for the San Diego Auto Museum Fundraising Gala. Terry and Barbie won the silent auction for the blimp ride.

The ten-ton Goodyear blimp is technically a semi-rigid airship, because the truss structure inside maintains the shape and strengthens the airship. The moniker “Goodyear Blimp” remained because it is so iconic and established in popular culture. The blimp is huge, 246 feet long and 65 feet wide. Goodyear began live aerial feed to viewers during the 1955 Rose Bowl game. It is powered by three 4-cylinder, 200 horsepower engines, with a top speed about 70 mph.



Upon boarding the Goodyear blimp, the pilot asked Barbie, “Where do you want to go?” (Somewhat different from the recent flight on United). Six passengers left the tarmac at Carson, off Interstate 405, and toured over Long Beach, Terminal Island and San Pedro with picture taking opportunities of the harbor, battleship *Iowa*, Vincent Thomas Bridge, the *Queen Mary* and cruise ships docked in the harbor. There is no gondola cockpit for the two pilots as on a plane, and the guest roamed freely around the gondola, with seatbelts only used for liftoff and landing. The gondola can accommodate 12 with a restroom. The blimp rises steeply, about 30 degrees and leveled off at 1,500 feet. During the tour, the pilot left her seat and joined the passengers, taking photos and explaining the blimp workings.



The ride is smooth, quiet, and exhilarating. It is a unique experience and worth bidding again at the next Auto Museum Gala. Included with the Goodyear blimp passes was a \$150 gift card to the Gulfstream restaurant in Newport Beach. The following day, the Goodyear blimp arrived in San Diego to cover the PGA golf tournament at Torrey Pines.



Call to Order / Attendance:

The Meeting was called to order at 6:45 pm via telephone conference by the Club President.

The officers present were Dan Jensen, President; Nedra Rummell, 2nd Vice President Membership; Dave Allen, Treasurer; Chuck Leuthen, Newsletter Editor; Al Steele, Director; and Terry Tilton, Auto Museum Representative. Although present and eager to attend, James Waite, Secretary, and Dave Putnam, Director, were not able to attend due to limitations in the teleconferencing software.

Board Reports:

- **Secretary's Report:** There were no minutes to approve as no meeting was held in December.

- **Treasurer's Report:**

Dave Allen reported that the December month activities include income of \$1,630.00 comprising \$750.00 received for the Cal Club Reunion and \$880.00 for the Holiday party.

Expenses for December were \$1,555.01 comprising AGM delegate expenses (\$200), Bank fees (\$169.28), Final expenses for the Cal Club reunion (\$339.39), Final Payment to Tom Ham's Lighthouse for additional guests at the Holiday Party (\$256.53), Payment to the Secretary of State for the SI-100 filing (\$20.00), monthly storage facility fees (\$144.00), Trophies and Awards (\$407.65) and payments for the website and Zoom (\$18.16). Overall, we had a net income of \$74.99 for the month. Our net expenses for the year were \$5,967.95 and reflect a conscious effort to provide best value for our members through significant subsidies for the popular formal dinners and luncheons. The club's finances continue to remain healthy.

The 2022 Financial Report was provided to support by-laws Section 8.03: Annual Report, which states: "The Newsletter Editor shall place a notice in the Club's electronic newsletter, within the time permitted by law, stating that an Annual Report is available by request."

January sneak peek: Income received so far includes Membership Dues and Advertising. Expenses so far include the two-year web hosting contract with Wild Apricot and the online processing fee to the Port Authority for the Concours.

- **Activities Report - 1st VP, Activities Dan Jensen/Nedra Rummell**

- As to the Windmill Food Hall with Drive set for January 11: Nedra reported that due to the potential for rain on January 11, she questioned if the event should be delayed. Dan proposed rescheduling the drive to February and the Board concurred. Nedra will advise all members of the postponement.
- As to the San Vicente Golf Resort Lunch with Drive set for March 4: Dan reported that the event is in the process of being finalized. Two routes to the venue will be used. Lunch will be a buffet.
- For a June event: It was discussed to have a possible drive. Bob and Ali Proctor have expressed an interest in sponsoring an event. If June does not work for them, Diah Avery agreed to arrange for a drive to and picnic at a winery.

- As to Cal Clubs Reunion Financials - Nedra reported via email that after income and expense, we had 56 attendees collecting \$1930 in income and \$2045.86 in expenses resulting in a cost to SDJC of \$115.86. Additionally, she has Membership income reports and various expense reports for Dave in order to close out 2022.
- **Jaguar Tracks Newsletter Report:**
 - Chuck reported that the January/February edition of the *Jaguar Tracks* was produced and disseminated. Reminder that it will be produced on a bi-monthly basis.
 - Chuck asked for information from the February Windmill event to be submitted for the February/March edition of newsletter.

- **Auto Museum** – Terry reported that the museum received a donation of a Tesla roadster, have opened up their exhibit of Unloved Cars, and that tickets for their annual Gala are selling well. The Gala theme is Country Western with Shane Smith and the Saints as the entertainment. Lastly, Terry recently took a ride in the Goodyear blimp and will forward a write-up and photographs to Chuck for Jaguar Tracks.
- **San Diego British Car Club Council (SDBCCC)** – Dave Putnam reported the following:
 - The Rolling British Car Day is set for Saturday, April 29, with the location TBD.
 - The San Diego British Car Day is set for Sunday, August 13, at Coronado Tideland Park.

- **Concours Chair & Property Manager** – Mark reported the following:
 - Mark will be present for the 2023 Concours as he is not leaving until August. This provides plenty of time for Terry and Dan to get up to speed for Concours planning for 2024 and beyond.
 - Before publishing details of the Concours on our website, Mark asked whether we wish the registration fees to remain the same or to be increased. - **Raffles / Roster / Awards** – Nedra – No report.
- **Social media** – As this position is open, there was no report.

Old Business:

- As to 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM): Nedra reported via email that she prepared an expense report for Dave for delegate reimbursement for attendance at the 2023 AGM as well as an income report with membership checks. She will deliver this to Dave this coming Saturday.
- As to Open positions: VP Activities, Webmaster, Social Media – Nedra is reworking the description of what is required for the Election Luncheon and Holiday Party to make planning easier.
- As to E-mails via Wild Apricot: Inclusion of advertisers in e-mails – Chuck reported that he has developed and presented for review a new email template that includes our advertisers and links to their web pages.
