National Weather Center Tour By Susan Frantz

Just over a dozen members and two guests showed up at the National Weather Center located on the campus of the University of Oklahoma for a tour of this important facility. What better place to study, watch, and predict the weather than in Oklahoma? Our tour guide, Faith, was a freshman from Lawton studying

meteorology. Her father is an amateur storm chaser and her fascination with weather began when accompanying him and watching storms together.



As the 2nd tallest building in Norman (after the Sarkeys Energy Center), the 7 story Weather Center is built to withstand a category 3 tornado. Staff and students are allowed to be in the observation tower only until a warning is issued, however. The view is unobstructed for miles.





Home to the National Weather Services, this is the only site in the U.S. where storm predictions are made. While we couldn't enter the area where all the maps and computers are utilized, there are large observation windows allowing a good view of what is taking place. It was interesting to note that the meteorologists still sometimes committed their data to paper for easier

analysis.

Our tour also took us outside to see the storm chasing vehicles. The largest of the trucks achieves a gas-guzzling 3-5 miles per gallon! (Feel better about your high-powered sports car?) Those behemoths have 3 fuel tanks. They also carry portable weather radar units, so watch out when you come to an overpass!




The other trucks are well equipped with cameras and radar – as well as steel grates encasing most of the truck and extending beyond the front ends to protect them from hail damage (somewhat successfully, at least).

We couldn't leave without seeing the movie props from the first *Twister* movie, which are on display on the first floor. There is also

a small "Flying Cow Cafe" for sandwiches and snacks. However, we opted for Mexican & Peruvian fare at Mamaveca's restaurant, also in Norman.

Our Club has lost another long-time member – Donald F. Ferrell. Don died at his home in Chandler on March 15, 2024, surrounded by his family. Don and Sally joined COJA

on January 24, 1997. Don and Sally were able to join us for our Christmas Party last year along with their daughter, Cynthia Ferrell Ashwood and husband, Albert. With the distance from Chandler, and after Don's illness, it became harder for them to make it to many of the Club events.

Don was active in so many things during his lifetime from his service in the US Air Force, to publisher of the Chandler newspaper to Oklahoma State Senate from 1966 to 1974. He served as Governor Henry Bellmon's press secretary (1965-1966). He was also a member of the Sooner Region Horseless Carriage Club and served on the advisory board of the Salvation Army in Shawnee, to name just a few.

Don and Sally lost a daughter, Susan Jane Ferrell, in the Oklahoma City Bombing in 1995.

As we have done in the past for our deceased members, a donation of \$100 from the Club was given in memory of Don to

one of his charities of choice – Oklahoma City National Memorial.

A Celebration of Don's life will be held on Saturday, April 6, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. at the First Baptist Church, 912 W. First Street, Chandler, Oklahoma.
