National Weather Center Tour By Susan Frantz

Frustrated with the Oklahoma weather? Complaints about predictions? Praise for the meteorologist who gets it right? Bring your questions and comments to the source of all weather knowledge!! We have a reservation for **Friday, March 15**th, at 10:00 a.m. for a guided tour of the National Weather Center located at the University of Oklahoma (120 David L. Boren Blvd., Norman). The tour will include visits to the McCasland Family Observation Deck, School of Meteorology, the NOAA/NWS Storm Prediction Center, the NWS Norman Weather Forecast Office and the National Severe Storms Laboratory. The tour lasts approximately 1 ½ hours.

There is availability for a minimum of 9 and maximum of 30 people per group. As a government entity, there are some rules that must be adhered to. Registration is required, so I will need names of all who plan to attend so I may submit those in advance of our visit (**no later than March 11**th). You must bring a government ID for entrance at the time of the tour. And there is a "clear bag" policy that must be adhered to, as well.

And, as an added incentive, we will gather after the tour for lunch at an old standard but newly returned campus restaurant, Pinocchio's Italian Restaurant, "Norman's Historic Italian Eatery". They are located at 2627 Classen Blvd., Suite 104 (NE corner of the strip mall). Their menu is attached to the back of the Tracks or you can view www.pinocchiosofnorman.com. They have told me that we can submit our food orders in advance for faster service. So, if you'd like to check out the choices, feel free to add your order to your RSVP and I will pass that along so they can be prepared for us. Otherwise, you can order when we get there! NOTE: I recently learned that sandwiches are available only on Wednesdays. Burgers will be available on Friday, March 15th, just not the two listed sandwiches – Pinocchio's Special and Meat Ball Sub.


Pyewacket's Progress
