Come one, come all to a "hands-on" tech session the morning of Saturday, April 6, 2024 at Gary Kincel's garage in White Oak, PA.

If you have not yet read the President's Perspective column in the March, 2024 Jaguar Jargon or Gary Kincel's article in the December Jaguar Jargon about his receiving the donation of and transporting to Pittsburgh, on behalf of the Coventry Foundation, the 1947 Jaguar Mk IV 3.5L Saloon then you have to go to our JCOP Website (jaguarclubofpittsburgh.org) and read those articles. If you did read those, please reread where each article ended by announcing Gary would be hosting another Tech Session where JCOP members would come and work together to help figure out the restoration plan for this vehicle.

On February 9 we worked to sort, organize, and catalogue all the parts he received and perform some preliminary restoration work on headlight buckets and wood dash parts. While originally Gary thought we would reconvene on March 9, that date needed to be pushed back to April 6 to allow him to arrange space in his building where the main carcass of the Mark IV could be moved, analyzed, and worked upon.

The plan of April 6 is to move the Mark IV out of the trailer *(in photos at right)* and push it up into the garage building; it needs people-power since the front axle has been removed and dollies hold up the front of the car. So Gary is looking for a good turnout to accomplish this manually, following which the body will be assessed piece by piece.

This is a wonderful opportunity for all members – old and new, experienced mechanically or not – to enjoy the camaraderie of being together and helping provide "hands-on" contributions for the Coventry Foundation mission to get this 1947 Mk IV restored and back on the road. And it is always a pleasure to see the many vehicles and other projects being performed in Gary's wonderful garage. (You can bring a portable chair with you, but we will mostly be on our feet.) For those whose schedules permit, we can go to lunch afterwards.

JCOP Member's Jaguar Mk 2 Restoration: Part 5

It's important to recognize one's shortcomings and know when to ask for help. I'm now waist-deep in the 1966 Mk2 wiring and had to do just that. Enter Xavier (he prefers Xavie), my grandson and Jaguar wiring prodigy. Here he is suggesting that the red wire should make the red lights on the back of the car turn on, which makes perfect sense. We took turns connecting the power supply to the red wire and running around the back to make sure the lights came on. Being a stickler for quality, we had to do this about 20 times to be sure.

With the garage temperature now regularly over my lower limit of 35 degrees, progress is being made. Under the hood, everything is complete with the exception of some rubber grommets and plugs that I need to sort out and the cable connections to the heater box that look like they will be nearly impossible to make once the engine is in place.

Speaking of the engine, it is nearly ready to be put into place. I have noticed a couple of places where I am not happy with my paint job on the block and after some on-line consultation, I have

decided to install the carburetors and linkage while the engine is still on the ground and I have good access. Access to the attaching nuts and linkage will not be great once the engine is in the car and the carburetors should not get in the way when installing the engine. It's time to bribe a friend or two with pizza and beer for an engine installation party.

I think I have mentioned before that I am converting the car from the stock 3-speed Borg Warner automatic to a modern 5speed manual Tremec 'box. Tremec purchased some portion of the Borg Warner transmission line many years ago and has continued to refine the products for different applications. The kit that I purchased has some reworked internals and a modified 5th gear ratio better suited to the torque and power band of the Jaguar XK engine. Ratios 1 through 4 are essentially the same as a stock Jaguar manual transmission with fifth gear being an overdrive for less buzzy highway use. Anyone with a US spec E-Type understands how tiring 3500 RPM at 70 MPH can be after a while. With all the low-end torque of the XK engine, an overdrive gear makes perfect sense.

Another selling point of the Tremec kit is that it places the shifter in more or less the stock location, assuming that your transmission tunnel even has a "stock location". Being that my car left the factory with an automatic transmission, there is no "stock location" and a hole had to be cut. I followed the "measure 20 times, cut once" rule and got to work with the cutoff wheel. The hole is



larger than it needs to be for the shifter but will allow for some maintenance from top. I will need to fabricate a (likely) fiberglass cover that will hold the rubber gator that seals the shift lever. For now, I am confident that the engine can be installed with no transmission interference. (*Continued on next page*)

JCOP Member's Jaguar Mk 2 Restoration: Part 5

As an interesting aside, my automatic spec car is already set up for the installation of a manual transmission. There is a bracket on the firewall to connect the clutch hydraulic hard line to the flex line. The pedal box already has the clutch pedal arm in place. For automatic cars, one big brake pedal attaches to both arms and for manual cars, each arm gets its own smaller pedal. The clutch master cylinder and reservoir is attached by removing a factory installed cover plate. It could not be easier, at least in terms of the mechanical bits.

Things are different on the inside. Jaguar went to great lengths to make everything common, but the backbone of the car, the transmission tunnel, is different. The automatic tunnel is wider and flatter, which means you need to retain the automatic center console and make sure you have a carpet kit for an automatic.

I'm very much looking forward to installing the engine and transmission. Completion of the dash wiring will follow, assuming that Xavie can find some time to help Pap.

While there are many ways to get there (one can use MapQuest or some other GPS navigation tool [although in previous years a couple folks said their GPS directions were awful] or access the North Park map on the Alle-gheny County Parks website), some suggested Directions are provided for convenience below but in all instances the Speed Limit in North Park is 25 mph unless marked lower and it is strongly recommended your obey the posted limit. Please do not park in the spaces in front of the entry to the shelter since those spaces are reserved for the Zappa and Benson vehicles to unload a lot of things for the picnic, including the food which is coming right before 1:00 PM.

If you are coming from the North

If you are coming south down Rt. 8, please know that this year the bridge that was closed in 2023 on Wildwood Road is now open so one can go directly on Wildwood Road into North Park. As one drives west on Wildwood Road from Rt. 8, keep going straight into North Park where the name of the road changes to E. Ingomar Road right after an Exxon Gas Station on your right. Go straight past the stoplight at Babcock Boulevard (where the Lake will come into view). Proceed to the next stoplight and turn RIGHT onto Kummer Road. After only a few yards, take the first RIGHT Turn onto Lake Shore Drive. The road splits almost immediately and you will bear LEFT onto Walter Road. Go past the first few buildings and up a hill and when you come to what appears to be an old church on your left, Roosevelt Shelter will appear on your right. Pull into the parking area and park on the side of the lot by Roosevelt Shelter but not right next to it since we will want some open space to get in and out of the lot and for deliveries of food, etc. If you are coming south down Rt. 19/McKnight Road, stay on McKnight Road where Rt. 19 splits off and you will immediately come to the Pine Creek Shopping Center on your right (where there is a Target Store and Giant Eagle). Go straight past the first light where there is a Walgreen's but get in the left lane and then the left turning lane for the next stoplight across from where there was a PNC Bank branch and there is the Giant Eagle and a KFC franchise. Turn LEFT onto Blazier Drive and follow that until it "T's" out at E. Ingomar Road. Turn LEFT onto E. Ingomar Road. Go until the stoplight at Kummer Road. Turn LEFT onto Kummer Road. After only a few yards, take the first RIGHT Turn onto Lake Shore Drive. The road splits almost immediately and you will bear LEFT onto Walter Road. Go past the first few buildings and up a hill and when you come to what appears to be an old church on your left, Roosevelt Shelter will appear on your right. Pull into the parking area and park on the side of the lot by Roosevelt Shelter but not right next to it since we will want some open space to get in and out of the lot and for deliveries of food, etc.


If you are coming from the South or East, get to either Rt. 8 or Rt19/McKight Road.

If you are coming North on Rt. 8, go to Wildwood Road (where there is a BP Gas Station and McDonalds on your right at the intersection). Turn LEFT onto Wildwood Road. Keep going on Wildwood Road and keep going into North Park where the name of the road changes to E. Ingomar Road right after an Exxon Gas Station on your right. Go straight past the stoplight at Babcock Boulevard (where the Lake will come into view). Proceed to the next stoplight and turn RIGHT onto Kummer Road. After only a few yards, take the first RIGHT Turn onto Lake Shore Drive. The road splits almost immediately and you will bear LEFT onto Walter Road. Go past the first few buildings and up a hill and when you come to what appears to be an old church on your left, Roosevelt Shelter will appear on your right. Pull into the parking area and park on the side of the lot by Roosevelt Shelter but not right next to it since we will want some open space to get in and out of the lot and for deliveries of food, etc.

<u>(Continued)</u> DIRECTIONS TO JCOP MAY 19, 2024 PICNIC @ ROOSEVELT SHELTER IN NORTH PARK

If you are coming North on McKnight Road, go past all the shopping centers and such. When you pass the McCandless Crossings Shopping area, go straight past the stoplight at Cumberland Road. You will then come to one more stoplight and go straight past that and get in the right lane. In about a quarter mile or so, you will see a sign that says to bear right to Hampton Township. Take that ramp to the right and it will bring you onto E. Ingomar Road. Go to the second stoplight and that will be at the intersection of Kummer Road. Turn LEFT onto Kummer Road. After only a few yards, take the first RIGHT Turn onto Lake Shore Drive. The road splits almost immediately and you will bear LEFT onto Walter Road. Go past the first few buildings and up a hill and when you come to what appears to be an old church on your left, Roosevelt Shelter will appear on your right. Pull into the parking area and park on the side of the lot by Roosevelt Shelter but not right next to it since we will want some open space to get in and out of the lot and for deliveries of food, etc.

If you are coming from the West or any other area not specifically noted above, either check a map to see how to get to one of the above locations and then proceed per the directions or call Stu Benson ahead of time and he can tell you how to best get to the picnic location. For example, if one is coming North on I-79, there is a right lane of the exit so as to then turn right onto Rt. 910 and immediately take the first RIGHT turn onto Brandt School Road. Follow this road until you turn left onto Pine Creek Road and take that until you get to the Pine Creek Shopping Center where you will see a Target store ahead. At a stop sign just past Walgreen's, turn left and then immediately turn RIGHT at the light onto McKnight Road. Go past the shopping center on your right and go to the next stop light and turn Left onto Blazier Drive. Follow Blazier Drive until you come to stop light and turn LEFT onto East Ingomar Road. Go to the next stoplight and that will be at the intersection of Kummer Road. Turn LEFT onto Kummer Road. After only a few yards, take the first RIGHT Turn onto Lake Shore Drive. The road splits almost immediately and you will bear LEFT onto Walter Road. Go past the first few buildings and up a hill and when you come to what appears to be an old church on your left, Roosevelt Shelter will appear on your right. Pull into the parking area and park on the side of the lot by Roosevelt Shelter but not right next to it since we will want some open space to get in and out of the lot and for deliveries of food, etc.
