recently released their fiscal year 2025 (which curiously ended on March 31) results to investors. The company has made an impressive and rapid recovery from the depths of its financial struggles. As recently as two years ago, the entire enterprise was on the ropes. Virtually every important financial metric was bad and had been so since hitting "rock bottom" in Fiscal Year (FY) 2019. FY2025 further improved on the solid recovery in FY2024. Highlights for FY2025 include:

- Best operating income since 2015,
- Second highest cash flow in JLR history, and
- Highest dividend in the company's history.

The management attributes this performance "to the success of their overall Reimagining Strate-

gy." The good news is that the firm is generating plenty of cash to support development and introduction of the Jaguar Type-00 and they appear to be pressing ahead.

While there is little to no new information regarding the Type-00 launch date or additional product details, the marketing program is going "full throttle." Their latest press release touts the Jaguar Art Awards and can be <u>viewed here</u>. The company's chief creative officer describes the entries as "unapologetically original" and consistent with the spirit of Jaguar. Art is in the eye of the artist and the viewer of that art. You be the judge.

Across all the JLR brands (Range Rover, Defender, Discovery and Jaguar) the firm appears to be internally aligned and well along the path of shifting "to a younger, more affluent and lifestyle led audience."

Interestingly, all brands except for Jaguar will continue to offer their customers the choice of internal combustion, hybrid and battery electric power trains. Jaguar is their only "all electric" brand.

If we only had a "fast forward" button on our personal time machines, we could learn whether we must be content with only maintaining the wonderful heritage of Jaguar or will witness the successful rejuvenation of the brand.



Meanwhile, consider attending the 2025 International Jaguar Festival which takes place September 25 – 28, 2025. The North Georgia Jaguar Club is organizing and hosting the

event in Cartersville, GA. They have organized an enjoyable program. Participating in an IJF is a great way to share experiences with members of JCNA clubs across North America. (see page 23)

I recently came upon an automotive history article from late last year ("10 Concept Cars of the 60's We Wish They'd Built", Nathan Chadwick, Hagerty News, 27 November 2024) which got me thinking about the curious current Jaguar state of affairs. There were some very eccentric prototypes mentioned in that piece (Alfa Romeo Carabo by Bertone, Plymouth VIP Concept Car, Buick Century Cruiser), as well as some that might actually have captivated 60's consumers (Maserati Simun, Lancia Flavia Super Sport by Zagato, Fiat 2300S Speciale by Pininfarina). I admit to a bias toward the Italian design-However, one British model stood above the pack—the venerable Jaguar XJ13 (1966).

XJ13-One of a Kind

It's curious that the XJ13 would be included among the collection of "concept cars", as it was actually a prototype racing car designed to compete at LeMans in the mid 60's. It seems that Ferrari had embarked upon the mid-engine design, and Jaguar wanted in. The XJ13 featured a gorgeous Malcolm Sayer designed body under which a 5-litre dual overhead cam V-12 with over 502 BHP was situated mid-car to achieve optimal weight distribution. Sadly, only one was ever produced and it never actually raced. By the time the XJ13 project hit its stride, the Ford GT40 had gotten the better of everyone else. Think Ford vs. Ferrari movie. Nevertheless, one can only dream of what might have been, had this one, or its street legal derivative, actually gone into production. Sigh.

As with most offerings in the enthusiast magazines online, the reader comments, while all over the proverbial lot, are sometimes more prescient than the article itself. No exception here. My favorite, from a reader identified only as "A.J.": "Jaguar ought to just backup and build the XJ13 now. It would be way cooler than the junk they are building now." Harsh, but a kernel of truth there, as we all await what's next from the Jaguar mothership. Oh, by the way, the XJ13 prototype has been restored and is currently valued in excess of \$7 million.



In breaking news regarding much less rare and expensive Jaguars, not to mention those in much less desirable condition, I'm happy to report that the two E-Type examples (a '67 Series 1 and a '73 Series 3, shown above), which I wrote about last month, have found a new home. Well, actually they are on their way to new homes. Well, hopefully. It seems that they were discovered by one of our loyal advertisers, Welsh Enterprises, who promptly sent a flatbed to pick them up and carry them off to their headquarters in Steubenville, Ohio. As predicted, I believe the Series 1 is destined to be restored. The Series 3 will be parted out, but will live on as an organ donor. Whether this turn of events came about as a result of that last column (maybe people actually do read The Jaguar's Purr?) or some other serendipitous connection, nevertheless their current caretaker was delighted that they are going, ultimately, to people who will appreciate them. Thanks to those of you who expressed an interest in these time machines. It was a real trip down the vehic-





JAGUAR'S NEW 420

JAGUAR CARS, INC., courtesy Johannes Eerdmans and John Dugdale, has given us a peek at the latest in the Jaguar line, the 420 and the 420 G.

The 420, which incorporates front-end sheet metal similar to that of the handsome Mark X, is slightly larger than the 3.8 S sedan it replaces. It now has the 4.2-liter double-overhead cam six in place of the 3.8-liter unit, and the horsepower is 245 instead of the 220-bhp rating of the S. Standard equipment for the U.S. market will include a new "Varamatic" power steering unit, disc brakes on all four wheels with separate hydraulic circuits front and rear, a new cooling system with larger radiator, and a new electric tachometer and transistorized electric clock. New interior details include padded dash

and padded parcel shelf. Like the entire Jaguar line, the 420 comes with independent suspension all around and limited-slip differential. Options available on the 420 are a new 2-speed automatic transmission, wire wheels, radio and tinted glass.

The 420 G model, based on the 4.2 sedan (formerly the Mark 10), has newly designed front seats with ventilated upholstery, padded dash, new exterior chrome striping, new wheel covers and an improved exhaust system.

The new 420 line, according to Jaguar Cars' president Johannes Eerdmans, will be introduced to the American market late this fall and will be displayed at the international auto shows in Los Angeles, Boston, San Francisco and Detroit after its world-wide debut at Earls Court, London.

It is just a short walk to the boardwalk and beautiful beach and only a few blocks to the one hundred shops and boutiques on Asbury Avenue.

Rooms are available to book now. The hotel is holding the most popular twenty-two of their twenty-nine rooms for us. Prices quoted are for the three-night stay and include room rental, free parking, taxes, fees and a prepared hot breakfast each day. Rooms and prices are as follows:

I encourage you to book your room now by calling the inn at 609-399-1558. **Do NOT book your room using the hotel website!** The discounted rate can only be obtained by phone. Use the room code "DVJC." Should your plans change, you may cancel for a full refund up to fourteen days prior to check-in.

Rooms are held for us at the discounted rate until August 17. However, if bookings are "slow" as of August 1, some rooms will be released to the public and may not be available if you wait until the "last minute." **Our advice? Book no later than August 1.**



Our fun begins on Tuesday with a Welcome Gathering and dinner on the porch at the Scarborough Inn. You'll need your sea legs for the sunset cruise on the BIG BEACHYTIKI on Wednesday evening. My personal Jaguar addiction began at Chesapeake Jaguar in Hunt Valley, MD in late 2003 when I purchased a pre-owned 1998 Vanden Plas which had been driven 22,000 pampered



miles.

years of muscle car fascination and into the pleasure of Jaguar ownership. Midsummer 2004, I sold my Corvette convertible because the Jag was, overall, more fun to drive than the pride of Bowling Green, Kentucky. Two short years later, I reluctantly made a prudent career decision and replaced the car with a supercharged Pontiac Bonneville SSEi because the optics of driving the Jag weren't good for me as VP of Manufacturing in a plant where the employee parking lots were populated with pickup trucks and American cars.



Not surprisingly, I could-n't scratch the itch and, a few short years later, purchased a Zircon 2005 XK8 convertible that Nancy and I used

for many rallies, club events and, frankly, for any other "good reason" we found to drive it. I expected to own this car until the passage of time compelled its sale. However, we weren't the only people who appreciated this car. While sharing a bottle of wine with good friends in Florida, our friend, Diane, stated that she and her husband love everything about the car and they want to buy it if it's ever for sale. (I'm not sure her husband knew that previously.) To put a quick end to that discussion, I told her that we had no intention of selling it and the only way that a sale would ever happen is if I bought a

supercharged version. I thought that would be the end of it!

Well, the deadly combination of an iPad and the XKR worm in my ear got the best of me. I zeroed in on finding a 2007, 2008 or 2009 XKR convertible, specifically because those models still had a shift lever in the center console. I quickly settled on BRG with a tan top and interior as the "right" color combination. After evaluating several offerings, I purchased a 2008 model with 48,000 miles on the odometer. The owner was an fastidious engineer who took meticulous care of the car, cosmetically and mechanically.

Honoring my commitment to Diane, I called and offered the XK8 to them. Five minutes later, she called back and said "yes." I still get to see and drive the car each year when we visit each other in Florida. It's well cared for in a "good home!"

I am pleased to have our car included as the July 2025 DVJC calendar car. While writing this article, I realized that this is the fifth car we have owned that is dark green with a tan interior and that four of the five have had tan tops. We are now enjoying this 2008 XKR for the third consecutive summer. The combination of great handling, sheer power and luxury is hard to beat!



2025 DVJC Concours d'Elegance and Cars and Motorcycles of England

The Delaware Valley Jaguar Club's signature event of the year, the 2025 Concours d'Elegance, is now in the books — and it was truly one to remember. Despite less-than-ideal weather forecasts leading up to the event, over 30 DVJC volunteers brought their tireless energy and wide ranging talents to make this a remarkable day.

The week before the Concours was filled with uncertainty. Severe thunderstorms, high winds, and heavy rains were forecast, causing several sponsors and participants to cancel. But the Concours Planning Committee remained resolute, meeting daily to evaluate conditions and prepare for every possibility. With the full support of our host facility, **Hope Lodge**, and in alignment with the State and Whitemarsh Township-approved Emergency Preparedness Plan, responsibilities were assigned and safety protocols established. We were ready — rain or shine.



Fortunately, Saturday morning dawned with only light rain and scattered showers, with occasional bursts of sunshine. Though warm and humid, it felt appropriately British for our themed event. Our dedicated team of DVJC volunteers, many of whom had set up the site the day before, arrived early and ready to adapt to whatever the day would bring. Thankfully, the heaviest rain held off until nearly all show participants were on their way home.



By 8:30 AM, the show field opened, organized by year and model — the oldest Jaguars placed nearest Hope Mansion and the newest closer to the entrance along South Bethlehem Pike. Champion, Driven, and Display classes were all arranged within this layout. Thanks to a geometric field plan orchestrated by **Greg Morrison** and implemented with Friday's volunteer team, cars were smoothly and precisely guided into place by many DVJC volunteers.

Two Operational Verification (OV) teams, led by DVJC Judges Ann Perry and Alan Karpovich, promptly inspected each vehicle as it arrived at its designated location. Judging sheets were secured inside the cars to await formal JCNA judging later in the morning in case of rain.

As the day progressed, occasional drizzle complicated the judges' work, but JCNA judging for



the Champion and Driven categories was successfully completed. The turnout was impressive:

- 10 Champion entries (with 4 absentees)
- 13 Driven entries (only 1 absentee)
- 12 Display entries on the Show Field (+/-)

Of course, there were many more Jaguars attending, including a very special Lister racing car displayed along with an extremely wide variety of British Cars and Motorcycles. Other entries not associated with the JCNA judging resided in the remaining CMoE display areas categorized by marque.

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The perfect gift for the British car enthusiast in your life

To Do or Undo, That Is The Question

On a once-in-a-lifetime basis, a product appears that is so good, so obviously necessary, and yet so inexpensive, you can't help but smack your forehead and wonder "How was this not seen before--what took so long?"

In October of 2022, I received an e-mail from Thomas Brobst, (not a member of DVJC) requesting to utilize my E-Type to size up his prototype of a tool for 'easily' negotiating Jaguar spinners. I was sorry (for several reasons) to inform him that I do not own an E-Type, but that there were likely to be several at the Brits-in-the-Village show that month. He later informed me that he had met up with several owners, including DVJC members, and that his invention needed work.

In April of 2024, after virtually destroying a heavy laminated plywood aid in an effort to break a spinner free from my 1967 S-Type, and then destroying a lead hammer in addition, I recalled the previous e-mail exchange. I inquired if his invention had been perfected, and were there pictures of it available. Having been assured that it was now in production, I was provided a video featuring Dr. David Glick, of Lewes, Delaware, who, though not a member of DVJC, is a Jaguar lover whom I knew from previous outings. His endorsement was so strong that I contacted Mr. Brobst again and bought his invention: the Un-do Stick.



In use, it is diabolically simple, and the most stubborn spinner is freed without damage to the car, or sweat to the owner. It is approximately 32" from the fulcrum points to the end of the handle, so applying 80 pounds of force, that's 200 ftlbs of torque applied to the spinner without danger of fender damage from a hammer. It fits neatly into the boot of any Jaguar.

For those with other British cars in their garage, the Un-do Stick is available for both standard sizes of spinners. There is a website, undostick.com, including video; sadly, Dr. Glick's effusive demonstration is no longer available.

Admittedly, this is a commercial product, and one might look askance at such an endorsement. Personally, I view this product as an invention that serves the British car enthusiast far more than it serves the manufacturer. There are other products that purport to perform this task, but this one is in a class of its own. It is functionally superior to any other method I have encountered.

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
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DVJC Wants You!
