Your Monthly Bill November 2025

October 2025 was a far better month for Jaguar owners and enthusiasts than it was for the Penn State Nittany Lions (three losses and one bye) or the New York Giants (one win vs. Eagles and three losses)! DVJC



members had plenty of days during which they could enjoy and display their cars. Nineteen members participated in the Century of Beautiful Automobiles at the Brantwyn Estate. A magnificent buffet brunch in elegant surroundings, specialty drinks (Lamborghini Bellinis) and eyecatching classic cars combined to make a wonderful day. The Grand Parade included cars owned by Tony and Mary Alice Tinari, Alex Cole and Judy Distell, Joe Lorini, Ed Petrow and Mike Eck and Becca Payonk. Alex and Judy's 1938 SS100 DHC won Best of Show. Thanks to Ed Petrow for organizing our club's participation in this classy event.

Typical English weather, damp with gray skies, set the backdrop for Brits at the TileWorks, an event organized by the Philadelphia MG Club. Four of our members (Alan Brown, Andrew Lazzaro, Tom Shaner and John Augenblick) won awards, all based on voting by spectators at the show. At the conclusion of the event, sixteen members drove a short distance to the New Britain Inn for a hearty lunch. Tom Shaner donated his time organizing the meal following the show. Thank you.

A special Main Line Cars and Coffee event preceded the Eagles' revenge win over the Giants on a bright and sunny October 26. Be sure to read Ed Petrow's article describing the day (page 20). Squeezed in between the fun, your board of directors held its regular quarterly meeting on October 23. Chuck Kitson and Tom Shaner responded to the open invitation for club members to attend the meeting and contribute their ideas for improving the club and increasing its value to members. Among the topics covered:

- Third quarter financial report
- Approval of a written AGM delegate expense policy
- 2026 budget approval
- Membership trends
- Converting member survey input to action
- First quarter 2026 event planning
- Club merchandise using our new logo



I am pleased to report that your club's finances continue to be in sound condition. Our cash balance is sufficient to continue to subsidize the cost of events, offer club merchandise at cost, provide the beautiful club calendar each year, fund normal operations and support the Coventry Foundation.

Recurring sources of income include member dues, sponsor support through advertising sales, the annual Concours d'Elegance surplus and silent auction proceeds. Our 2025 income was bolstered by a net surplus realized from the 2025 AGM hosted by our club.

A portion of your annual dues payment is paid by DVJC to JCNA with the balance retained by your club. Each year, the JCNA board of directors establishes the required "per member" dues paid by all clubs. The DVJC board then determines the added amount necessary to support our local club operations and, thus, the aggregate dues paid each year by DVJC members. Annual DVJC dues increased to \$75 (from \$65) in 2022 when JCNA raised its component from \$30 to \$40. JCNA expenses have increased for two primary reasons. First, compensation expenses are higher because fewer JCNA members are volunteering for administrative roles which have been filled by paid contractors. Second, inflation has driven

Jaguar Journal expenses higher (primarily paper, printing and mailing costs). JCNA dues were bumped up again in 2024 and 2025 while DVJC dues remained the same at \$75. The JCNA board has implemented several administrative cost reduction measures and reduced Jaguar Journal costs. These actions allowed them to keep 2026 JCNA dues at \$55/member.

The net result of the JCNA dues increases since 2022 is that DVJC's "take" from your \$75 annual dues payment has declined by 43%, from \$35 to \$20. Recognizing your club's sound finances, the DVJC board has voted to continue dues at \$75 for 2026, the fifth consecutive year without an increase. Don't wait! Log in now to renew your membership for 2026.



Once per year, delegates from JCNA clubs throughout North America gather at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) to discuss and vote on a variety of business and

competition issues. The DVJC board has consistently supported the AGMs by paying meeting and travel expenses for two club delegates. Our club benefits in many ways. In addition to input on business affairs, establishing personal relationships with JCNA officers and representatives of other clubs pays continuous dividends. For example, event ideas, website experiences, and member recruiting techniques are readily shared. Most importantly, personal networks develop. These relationships enable easy calls to other members for advice on a wide variety of topics.

Our 2026 budget includes funds for two delegates to the AGM in Mexico City, scheduled April 14 – 19, 2026. Jaguar Club Mexico has organized a wonderful program that combines JCNA business with plenty of time for sightseeing around the city and absorbing the automotive eye candy (400 – 500 cars) at the multi-day Concours d'Elegance. Please consider serving as one of our delegates to this year's meeting. No prior experience is required nor is any service as a DVJC board member. 





2021 E-Pace—November Calendar Car:

My wife, Jean Thompson, is the driver of this SUV, a 2021 Jaguar E-Pace. This car had an extremely unusual beginning with us, but more on that later.

Jean and I (Bill) are native Californians, having lived there most of our lives aside from a 7 ½ year period when we lived in Rockland County, NY. We have a daughter, son-in-law and two young grandsons living in Newark, DE. A second daughter lives in Rochester, NY. In 2020, as a family, we made the decision to move to Delaware to be closer to our daughters, grandsons, and son-in-law.

We bought a lot in a 55+ community named Independence, near Millsboro in rural southern DE and began the building of our new home. We had 4 cars and decided to ship 3 to Delaware, selling the 4th, Jean's 2014 Jaguar XF. By phone with Union Park Jaguar, we ordered this 2021 E-Pace. All went well up to our final June 2021day in California. The E-Pace was waiting for us in Delaware, we sold Jean's XF on the way to the airport, we flew to Philadelphia, took a taxi to Union Park, and met their sales manager, Rob Shipley. Rob gave us an hour orientation with our new E-Pace, we put our luggage in the car and began our drive to our new Delaware home. Our extremely unusual beginning with this car was about to begin.

As we approached the Roth Bridge, the engine began missing badly and then stopped. We coasted down the bridge onto an exit. Once there, we found the engine would not start, so we called Union Park. They sent out a flat-bed, which hauled us back to the dealership where we were given a loaner F-Pace. We again headed out to our new home.

The next day, the dealership told us, with just 35 miles on the odometer, that the engine had blown up. A spark plug was missing from one of the cylinders and pieces of it were found in the cylinder and in the crankcase.

In the end, all turned out well. A replacement engine was ordered from the UK, we kept the F-Pace loaner until the new engine was installed about 4 months later. Union Park made loan payments for us until our E-Pace was again ready for us.

Since then, our E-Pace has been a great car. It now has about 15,000 miles on it and it was first in class at a DVJC Concours a couple years ago, a win made easy because our car was the only one in its class. E-Pace Jaguars, in fact, are quite rare, as I've seen only a couple in the past 4+ years.




2021 E-Pace SUV — DVJC Calendar Car for November 2025







A seasonably chilly morning introduced the promise of a sunny and mild day to DVJC Jaguar members and non-DVJC owners who fired up their cars early to participate in this special edition of the Main Line Cars and Coffee event held



in the Chesterbrook Office Park around 1300 Morris Drive. While it was only about 36 F when I left our home, I braved the chilly morning's first

light in our open XKE to rendezvous with our Membership Director, Tony Tinari and a small group of DVJC members at the show area at 8 AM. Tony and I had previously hatched a plan to actively recruit new members at this special event and had encouraged a good showing of DVJC Jaguars. We were not disappointed.

We were ready for the crowds to appear around 9 AM with ample supplies of coffee, doughnuts

and DVJC promotional materials including a stack of extra 2025 calendars. We were not disappointed as a record number of show cars apthis peared at



next to last eventCars and Coffee of the year. There were examples of nearly every marque including the usual herd of prancing horse Ferraris, bullish Lamborghinis, elegant Porsches, BMWs, Aston Martins, Corvettes, Camaros and Ford Mustangs of nearly every year and description. There were even some special appearances by a rare, rally entry Lancia B20 GT with air conditioning and a rarely seen Citroen President with working hydraulic suspension! Cars and Coffee events began in car-crazy California around 2007. They are unrelated to each other and are now held practically everywhere in the world. It remains today as a unique opportunity for car enthusiasts of every description to meet and talk about cars on display with no pres-

sure for judging, authenticity, originality, level of radical modifications or racing provenance. Our local Main Line Cars and Coffee events were originally organized by the founder, Brett Mezrow, in 2021 at the Bryn Mawr train station and quickly outgrew that parking lot and several others ultimately residing at the expansive Chesterbrook Office Park. Remarkably, Brett started all of this while he was a junior in school and continues to plan and manage these events today.

Unlike many other ad hoc car shows, this one is extensively planned with the cooperation of local police to handle the several thousand cars and visitors that usually



show up on a Sunday morning when most businesses in the office park are closed. With some modest financial support from vendors such as automobile dealers, service providers and insurance companies, the event is held once a month from Spring through Fall at no cost to registered display cars or spectators. Not usually featuring any special marque, this particular show was an exception that Brett and I planned to help boost DVJC membership and provide a window into this particular series of cars shows that many members have never seen. I believe the event was a huge success as many potential new members asked questions about our club and all of us were always ready to talk up our club activities, comradery and unique resources. When the day was done, we had given away all our promotional materials resulting in at least one new member signing up online later in the day.




