The Curta Calculator and Its Use in Car Events

Today, when we think of a calculator, we think of an application on our smartphone or maybe a silent digital electronic device. Well, before electrical calculators, there were mechanical calculators. Mechanical calculators are generally bulky, heavy, and not very portable, totally unsuitable for any mobile activity, including navigation calculations in car rallies. However, the Curta Calculator is one exception.

Curt Herzstark, a talented engineer from Vienna, began developing the concept for a compact calculator in the late 1930s. His ambition was to shrink the unwieldy desk calculators of the day into a single hand-held device. The escalation of World War II, however, would upend his life and work. When Herzstark was arrested and sent to the Buchenwald concentration camp for his political beliefs and his heritage, he continued his work on the calculator in secret. The camp guards learned of his engineering expertise and permitted him to pursue his invention, hoping it could be presented to their leaders as proof of the camp's productivity.

Despite the cruel circumstances, Herzstark carefully refined his designs, mentally solving mechanical puzzles and committing the details to memory. Upon lhis reliease, he was able to recreate his plans, and the post-war years relocated to Liechtenstein to collaborate with Liechtenstein's manufacturing firms. By 1948, after overcoming technical and financial obstacles, the first Curta calculators were produced—a triumph of resilience and technical prowess.

Two generations of the calculator were produced. The Type I was launched in 1948 with 11-digit capability for \$125, and the Type II was launched in 1954 with 15-digit capability for \$164. Production ended in 1972.

At a glance, the Curta looks deceptively simple: a black cylinder topped with a silver crank like a pepper grinder. But inside, hundreds of finely tuned gears, levers, and sliders work together. Users set numbers using sliders on the side, then crank the top to perform operations—each rotation advances the

internal mechanism, clicking through calculations with remarkable speed and accuracy.

The Curta can perform addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division, all without electricity. The mechanical solution to carrying, borrowing, and shifting digits was both ingenious and robust. Its size—small enough to fit in the palm—meant it could be used anywhere, from laboratories to field surveys to the open road.

The world of competitive rallying is defined by precision. Navigators must constantly recalculate distances, speeds, and timings, often in real time as cars race through unpredictable terrain. Before the advent of digital devices, the Curta was the rally navigator's trusted companion. It enabled navigators to convert distances, calculate average speeds, and adjust for time controls—all tasks fundamental to rallying success.

Stories can be found of rally teams, huddled in their vehicles amid rain-soaked forests or sunburnt deserts, relying on the Curta's mechanical "click" to guide them. Even after electronic calculators emerged, some navigators preferred the Curta for its ruggedness and absolute reliability; it never failed due to dead batteries or electronic glitches. Rally legends have credited the Curta with giving them the edge in grueling competitions.

- Teams used it to compute fuel consumption, split times, and intervals between checkpoints.
- Its compact form fit easily in the cockpit, and its tactile feel allowed calculations in bumpy conditions.
- The Curta's precision was so respected that some rallies specified its use in official instructions before electronic devices were allowed.

Though production ceased in 1972 as electronic calculators became prevalent, the Curta remains an object of fascination for collectors, engineers, and motorsport enthusiasts. Its enduring appeal is found in forums, museums, and vintage rally events, where

owners demonstrate their devices and recount tales of its prowess.

Today, the Curta is remembered as a symbol of ingenuity forged in adversity and stands out one of the last great mechanical calculators, an emblem of perseverance and practical artistry. In the annals of motorsport and mechanical engineering, its legacy continues—celebrated by those who value precision, history, and the quiet strength of a hand-cranked device that once changed the world one calculation at a time.
