# Read it Here

## 7. Active Aerodynamics 2.0

- The Tech: Moveable body parts like wings, flaps, and diffusers that adjust in real-time to optimize the car's shape for different driving conditions—low drag for efficiency on straights, high



downforce for grip in corners.

- Why it's Amazing: It's a "have your cake and eat it too" technology, offering both high efficiency for long electric range and exceptional handling for spirited driving.

- Who's Bringing it: Porsche and even Formula 1 race cars are adopting advanced active aero in 2026.
- Jaguar Connection: The 2026 Jaguar GT is engineered for "ultimate composure" and high performance. To achieve its targeted 400+ mile range while delivering a thrilling drive, advanced aerodynamics will be a key component of its design. ## 8. Panoramic Vision HUD

- The Tech: A head-up display that projects information across the entire lower width of the windshield, visible to both the driver and front passenger.

- Why it's Amazing: It's a proactive safety feature that can detect driver fatigue or a medical emergency and take action. It also offers a new level of personalization, adjusting settings based on who is driving and how they are feeling.
- Who's Bringing it: Tech companies like trinamiX are debuting these systems for 2026 vehicles.
- Jaguar Connection: This technology aligns perfectly with the concept of modern luxury, which increasingly includes wellness and personalized


EXCITING NEWS ABOUT A NEW

**\* Growing the Pride:** We want to welcome the next generation of Jaguar enthusiasts. Whether they drive a vintage Mark II or a


brand-new I-PACE, there is a seat for them at our table.




